

PROCEEDINGS OF THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Center, Nebraska
May 9, 2019
9:30 a.m.

A regular meeting of the Knox County Board of Supervisors was held in the Boardroom at the Knox County Courthouse in Center, Nebraska on the date of May 9, 2019 at 9:30 a.m. Present were Supervisors Martin J. O'Connor District #1, Patrick J. Liska District #2, Virgil H. Miller District #3, James Sokol, Jr. District #4, Kevin D. Mackeprang District #5, Danny R. Schlote District #6 and James J. Borgmann District #7. Absent was none. Chairman Sokol, Jr. presiding.

Supr. Miller led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. announced to the public that a copy of the Public Open Meeting Act was posted in the Boardroom.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Creighton News newspaper, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was opened to the attendance of the public.

The minutes of the April 25 and April 29, 2019 meetings were read. Chairman Sokol, Jr. approved the April 25 and April 29, 2019 meeting minutes as read.

Correspondence reviewed was: 1. Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice letter stating that an annual inspection of the Knox County Jail will take place on June 12, 2019; 2. Poster from Laurie Larsen for a flood relief fund raiser which will be held on July 7, 2019 for Knox and Boyd Counties for road improvement; 3. City of Crofton TIF Report.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Miller that all claims, except Claim #19050089 payable to Schreier Lumber, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Liska that Claim #19050089 payable to Schreier Lumber in the amount of \$25.48 written from the Road Fund, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Abstain District #3. Motion carried.

Claims totaling \$548,255.67 are listed at the end of these proceedings.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. moves the Board recess at 10:14 a.m. for Board of Equalization.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 10:25 a.m. with all members present.

Hwy. Supt. Barta met with the Board on the following: 1. A revised quote from Husker Steel was reviewed for the Fuchtmann Bridge. The original quote approved at the April 25, 2019 meeting did not include H-Piling so the additional cost will be \$5,500 over the first proposal of \$21,949. Motion by Supr. Borgmann, seconded by Supr. Mackeprang to accept the revised quote from Husker Steel in the amount of \$27,449 for steel products to repair the west abutment on County Bridge #95-27W8 in Creighton Township ("Fuchtmann" Bridge). By roll call. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 2. Discussion was held on the Roadrunner road drag the Board had approved purchasing at the April 25, 2019 meeting. The demo machine that was being used was determined to not meet the County's needs. A Bonnell 312 Road maintainer from Midwest Service & Sales had been viewed and determined to be a better fit for the County. Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supervisor Mackeprang, (corrected 5-30-2019) to rescind the motion from the April 25, 2019 meeting where the Board of Supervisors approved purchasing one Roadrunner road drag from Jet Plain Company of DeWitt, Nebraska for \$25,000 with the option to purchase a second one, and now moves to purchase a Bonnell 312 Road maintainer from Midwest Service Sales in the amount of \$15,000.00. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 3. A final bill on the Lindy North road project was received from the Nebraska Department of Transportation in the amount of \$30,331.86; 4. Supr. O'Connor said that a used tractor has been rented from Kayton International in Crofton at \$55.40 per hour. The rented tractor is being used to pull a road drag. Discussion was held on a lease option where a tractor could be leased for five years with the dealer paying the costs of any repairs. More discussion will be held at a later date; 5. A quote was reviewed for a used JD 310 K backhoe from Murphy Tractor & Equipment Co. in Sioux City IA in the amount of \$65,300. This machine would replace the flood-damaged backhoe. Motion by Supr., Miller, seconded by Supr. Liska to accept a quote from Murphy Tractor & Equipment Co. in Sioux City IA for a used 2015 John Deere 310K loader backhoe tractor in the amount of \$65,300 noting that the NIRMA insurance reimbursement payment received for the flood-damaged backhoe will be \$56,000 to be used toward the purchase of the replacement backhoe. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 6. County/Township Allocation. Due to the conditions of roads and the weather, there is a shortage of gravel at this time and many roads are still needing work so some townships will not be able to have the gravel put on the township roads before the middle of June. Discussion ensued on giving the townships an extension to use the 2018/2019 fiscal year County/Township Allocation funds until September. A letter will be sent to the townships advising them of an extension; 7. The transmission is out on the Kenworth truck. Discussion was held on possibly renting a truck for several months, purchasing a truck listed on the State bid, and trying a demo Western Star truck. More research will be made; 8. Discussed the proposed EWP project through NCRS for mitigation to replace rip rap that was taken by flood waters. Discussion was held on the different programs and cost sharing.

Zoning Administrator Doerr met with the Board on the following: 1. At 11:00 a.m., Chairman Sokol, Jr. opened the advertised public hearing on Conditional Use Permit #CU0015C for Toy Shed Storage LLC. Troy Behounek was present. Discussion was held on the design of the proposed building, fencing, and the typography of the property. Chairman Sokol, Jr. closed the public hearing at 11:12 a.m. There was no one present in opposition to the permit. Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Mackeprang to adopt **Resolution #2019 -04** approving Conditional Use Permit #CU0015C to amend Conditional Use Permit #CU0015 and #CU0015B for Toy Shed Storage LLC on a tract in the N1/2N1/2NE1/4 of Section 23, T33N, R2W of the 6th P.M., Knox County, Nebraska, and permit is for the construction of an additional self-storage building. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION #2019 -04

WHEREAS, Toy Shed Storage LLC has applied for Conditional Use Permit #CU0015C to amend Conditional Use Permit #CU0015 and #CU0015B to construct an additional self-storage building on the following described real estate:

The North ½ of the North ½ of the Northeast ¼ of Section Twenty-three (23), Township Thirty-three (33) North, Range Two (2) West of the 6th P.M., Knox County, Nebraska, **LESS** the following tracts:

Commencing at the Northeast corner of said Section Twenty-three (23), thence S 89° 58' 05" W along the north section line a distance of 708.65 feet; thence on an assumed bearing of S 00° 00' 00" E a distance of 54.82 feet to a point of beginning on the south right-of-way line of Knox County Highway 54C; thence continuing S 00° 00' 00" E a distance of 605.18 feet; thence S 89° 58' 05" W a distance of 784.08 feet; thence N 00° 00' 00" E a distance of 619.10 feet back to said south right-of-way line; thence N 88° 53' 54" E along said south right-of-way line a distance of 170.76 feet; thence S 88° 26' 06" E continuing along said south right-of-way line a distance of 613.58 feet to the point of beginning; **AND** Commencing at the Northeast corner of said Section Twenty-three (23), thence S 89° 58' 05" W along the north section line a distance of 708.65 feet; thence on an assumed bearing of S 00° 00' 00" E a distance of 54.82 feet to a point of beginning on the south right-of-way line of Knox County Highway 54C; thence continuing S 00° 00' 00" E a distance of 605.18 feet; thence S 89° 58' 05" W a distance of 670.04 feet to the West right-of-way line of Nebraska Highway 121; thence N 00° 32' 26" E along said Nebraska Highway 121 West right-of-way a distance of 594.79 feet back to said Knox County Highway South right-of-way line; thence N 89° 15' 06" W along said South right-of-way line a distance of 589.81 feet; thence N 88° 26' 06" W continuing along said South right-of-way line a distance of 85.92 feet to the point of beginning; **AND** Also excepting that property deeded to the State of Nebraska for highway purposes in Deed Book 86 at Page 401 and in Deed Book 86 at Page 412 of records of the Knox County Register of Deeds' Office.

WHEREAS, the Knox County Planning Commission has given public notice and held a public hearing on February 12, 2019, and March 12, 2019, and

WHEREAS, the Knox County Planning Commission has found that the application complies with the Knox County Zoning Regulations, and hereby makes a recommendation to approve the permit with the following conditions:

1. One business sign up to 80 square feet is allowed to be placed on the property (not on the right-of-way).
2. A security fence similar to the existing fence shall be erected between Building C and Building D.
3. No outside storage is allowed.
4. The structure shall be of similar color to the original two structures.
5. Under the soffit lighting shall be included on the West side of Building C and East side of Building D.
6. Applicant shall show compliance of diversion of water before construction begins.
7. Permanent diversion of water shall be installed during construction and in the future to control the runoff.
8. Two rows of trees shall be planted on the north side of Building D within one year of completion of construction and shall be maintained for the life of the Conditional Use.
9. Two rows of trees shall be planted north of building A and two additional rows of trees planted on the east side of Building A for a total of 4 rows as shown on CU0015 before a Zoning permit is issued for Building C & D. These trees will have to be maintained for the life of the Conditional Use.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS that the Toy Shed Storage LLC Conditional Use Permit #CU0015C be approved.

2. Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Schlote to place on file the April Zoning Permits Report. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Jerad Reimers from Representative Adrian Smith's office updated the Board on the committees and work being done in Washington D.C. including rural care, legislation, tax reform, health reform to cut red tape for rural care, the Rush Act that provides options for long care sites to have paramedics check patients before an ambulance comes or to determine if one is needed, House rules, looking at tariffs to be repealed, trade, and disaster tax relief. Supr. O'Connor said that he appreciated Representative Smith for contacting Supr. O'Connor's son, Daniel, after a visit to Washington D.C. and Chairman Sokol, Jr. expressed his gratitude for the personal contact after the flooding. Supr. Miller asked that his concerns of keeping the small private care centers operating be addressed.

Sheriff Henery met with the Board on the following: 1. Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. O'Connor to approve the Interlocal Law Enforcement Agreement between the Boyd County Sheriff's Office and the Knox County Sheriff's Office. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 2. Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. O'Connor to approve the Interlocal Agreement between the County of Knox and the Village of Verdigre for Law Enforcement Services noting that there is an increase from \$50 per hour to \$60 per hour. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 3. Discussed Crofton City law enforcement. A new Chief of Police was sworn in there recently. Also discussed was the welfare check process and that a copy of a law enforcement interlocal agreement was sent to Mayor Lawhead for their review.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. moves the Board recess at 12:05 p.m. for lunch.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 12:45 p.m. with all members present.

Zoning Administrator Doerr updated the Board on the lawsuit on the case of Pat Harts vs Knox County. The court date is August 8 at 9:00 a.m.

Emergency Manager Hintz updated the Board on FEMA issues and she expressed her appreciation for their assistance. The Board conducted the annual job evaluation of Emergency Manager Hintz.

Hwy. Supt. Barta continued with the following: 9. Update on bridge projects; 10. The condition of the Lindy/Santee road has improved. More material will be hauled from the Jessen pit; 11. Update on the Verdel gravel roads and the Center North bottom road. It has slow going due to the gravel shortage; 12. Prouty Construction Company crushed the concrete at the Creighton County yard; 13. More mixture has been received to fix potholes; 14. Discussed replacing equipment in the Niobrara Shed, cleaning of the Shed and the need to replace the electrical panel, switches and outlets both in the Niobrara and Verdigre Sheds; 15. Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. Liska to go into executive session at 1:11 p.m. so as to protect the reputation of an individual while discussing personnel. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried. Chairman Sokol, Jr. reiterated that the executive session will be held so as to protect the reputation of an individual while discussing personnel. The Board came out of executive session at 1:30 p.m. Motion by Supr. Liska, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to close at 1:30 p.m. the executive session that was held on personnel. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Liska to place on file the Clerk of the District Court April Fee Report. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Liska, seconded by Supr. Mackeprang to approve a cost sharing of \$500 to the SD/NE Purple Loosestrife Committee for galerucella beetles used to control purple loosestrife. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on the levy allocation given annually to the Knox County rural fire districts and the recently approved LB 63 that has an emergency clause. The Knox County MFO committee needs to send reports to the State for the Mutual Finance Organization (MFO) funds and will need to know this year's allocation. Motion by Supr. Borgmann, seconded by Supr. Mackeprang to continue the levy allocation to the Knox County rural fire districts at 4.5 cents again for the 2019/2020 fiscal year. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. Schlote that the receipts totaling \$151,411.82 be accepted and placed on file. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.
