A regular meeting of the Knox County Board of Supervisors was held in the Boardroom at the Knox County Courthouse in Center, Nebraska on the date of December 10, 2019 at 9:30 a.m. Present were Supervisors Martin J. O'Connor District #1, Patrick J. Liska District #2, Virgil H. Miller District #3, James Sokol, Jr. District #4, Kevin D. Mackeprang District #5, Danny R. Schlote District #6 and James J. Borgmann District #7. Absent was none. Chairman Sokol, Jr. presiding.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. announced to the public that a copy of the Public Open Meeting Act was posted in the Boardroom.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Creighton News newspaper, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was opened to the attendance of the public.

Liska to approve and authorize Chairman Sokol, Jr. to sign the contract between Knox County and KEA Constructions LLC for construction of the Bloomfield Northwest Bridge, Project C-54(897B) ("Ray Stark" bridge). By roll call vote. Ayes

Districts #1, #2, #3, #4, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent District #5. Motion carried; 6. The tractor to pull the roller has a hole in the head gasket and will need to be fixed or overhauled.

Supr. Mackeprang returned to the meeting at 10:05 a.m.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. moves the Board recess for Board of Equalization at 10:05 a.m.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 10:09 a.m. with all members present.

The Board, the Raymond Township Board, Senator Tim Gragert and a large group of landowners/residents from the Lazy River Acres area discussed the issues from the ongoing flooding of the Ponca Creek; the constant wet conditions making it difficult to clear out debris and silt; a reliable alternate route is needed when the Rayder Swanson Road is closed due to flooding; improvements needed on the west "Goat" road; impact of the flooding on residents as well as farmers and business; keeping ditches cleaned out; installing a concrete culvert system; options of 1) dredging in the winter when frozen, 2) build a levy north of the Ponca Creek and 3) rebuild "Goat" road; funds expended so far for gravel and maintenance; dredging going out to the Missouri River and restrictions that dredged materials cannot be put into a flood plain but would have to be trucked out; Corps admitted this is their problem; permit process and waivers that can be applied for from the Corps; this is not a money issue but is a safety matter; Highway 12 needs to be corrected; there is no quick fix in this matter; people need to have their own emergency plan and can't wait for the government; thankful for quick response to get people out this spring; loss of revenue; changes to the area after the March flooding; and detour signs are needed. A letter was presented to the Board from Rocky Latorra who was unable to attend the meeting. A resolution will be drafted by County Attorney Thomas and acted upon later in the meeting. The resolution will address the need for the State of Nebraska, Department of Transportation, and the US Army Corps of Engineers along with other federal agencies to immediately study, authorize and provide funding for a project to contain the Ponca Creek flood waters as well as waivers of all restrictions and to expedite solutions on dredging, deposits of silt and other actions necessary to protect the Rayder Swanson Road and Bridge from flooding from the Missouri River and Ponca Creek.

Emergency Manager Hintz and the Board discussed the proposed NRIN tower. The proposed tower will now have to be approximately 300 feet high if the site is at the Center County Yard. Discussed was the Ponca Tower Project in Dixon County. More discussion with the NRIN Board will be held.

County Attorney Thomas and Deputy County Attorney Holecek updated the Board on the Harts v Knox County court case and options for consideration.

Hwy. Supt. Barta and the Board discussed who will maintain the "Goat" Road west of Lazy River Acres. Currently Pahl Construction is hired by the Raymond Township Board to maintain the road. The Board feels that if the County closes the Rayder Swanson Road then in turn the County needs to help somewhat on the "Goat" Road and will consider paying for part of the costs of snow removal and maintaining. Hwy. Supt. Barta will talk to Layne Pahl and the Raymond Township Board. Also discussed was the culvert options on the Rayder Swanson Road and Hwy. Supt. Barta will talk to Engineer Mark Mainelli.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. moves the Board recess for lunch at 12:01 p.m.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 12:53 p.m. with all members present.

This Resolution of the Knox County Board of Supervisors is related to our Resolution No. 2019-05 dated May 30, 2019, copy attached.

The Ponca Creek (River) in Knox County is a tributary of the Missouri River. It now continually floods, and the flooding is caused by sediment that has built up in the creek bed caused by the regulation of the Missouri River.

The Ponca Creek flooding will require the paved Rayder Swanson Road from the State Highway 12 to Lazy Rivers Acres to be closed this winter and at other times into the future. Lazy River Acres is a community of hundreds of residents and their 200 homes, properties and businesses. With Swanson Road flooding and closed, emergency health and other public services access to Lazy River Acres will have to depend on upgrading and continuing costly public maintenance expenses of the Raymond Township gravel, a/k/a "Goat Road." There will be times when the Goat Road will be impassable.

The County Board of Supervisors urges the State of Nebraska, Department of Transportation, and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and other federal agencies that may be involved, to immediately study, authorize and provide funding for a project to contain the flood waters of Ponca Creek. The costs of such a study and related permits and project costs should be paid by the United States agencies that caused the sediment problem and not by the local governmental agencies that are the victims impacted by the flooding.

The County Board of Supervisors also requests the U.S. Corps of Engineers, NRCS, USDA, and other Federal Agencies to waive all restrictions and expedite solutions on dredging, deposits of silt, and other actions necessary to protect the Rayder Swanson Road and Bridge from flooding from the Missouri River and Ponca Creek.
