

# PROCEEDINGS OF THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Center, Nebraska  
March 26, 2020  
9:30 a.m.

A regular meeting of the Knox County Board of Supervisors was held in the Boardroom at the Knox County Courthouse in Center, Nebraska on the date of March 26, 2020 at 9:30 a.m. Present were Supervisors Patrick J. Liska District #2, Virgil H. Miller District #3, James Sokol, Jr. District #4, Kevin D. Mackeprang District #5, Danny R. Schlote District #6 and James J. Borgmann District #7. Absent was Supervisor Martin J. O'Connor District #1. Chairman Mackeprang presiding.

County Clerk Fischer led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Mackeprang announced to the public that a copy of the Public Open Meeting Act was posted in the Boardroom.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Wausa Gazette newspaper, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was opened to the attendance of the public.

The minutes of the March 12 and March 21, 2020 meetings were read and were approved by Chairman Mackeprang.

Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Sokol, Jr. that all claims, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #4, #5, #6, and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #1. Motion carried. Claims totaling \$295,217.21 are listed at the end of these proceedings.

Chairman Mackeprang moves the Board recess at 9:57 a.m. for Board of Equalization.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 10:04 a.m. with all members present except absent was Supr. O'Connor District #1.

Hwy. Supt. Barta met with the Board on the following: 1. Bloomfield North Overlay Project. Western Engineering Company would like to start the asphaltic project May 1 if possible. Discussion was held on the Bloomfield Coop road, construction options and Bloomfield City payment option; 2. Creighton Cold Storage Shed. Bids are to be submitted by April 8 for the construction of the shed and the bids will be opened at the April 9, 2020 meeting. Supr. Sokol, Jr. asked about the current budget or if the project would have to be paid from the next budget year, possibly foregoing purchasing a pickup and using that budgeted amount towards the building cost, and funds on hand. The Board will have a better budgetary idea after reviewing the bid amounts and starting/ending dates; 3. Applications are being taken to fill the District Three motorgrader position and a bridge crew position. The deadline to submit applications is March 31, 2020; 4. "Ray Stark" bridge project update; 5. "Abbenhaus" bridge project update; 6. Update on Lazy River Acres road. The Ponca Creek continues to flood the road and is running over the road north of the bridge. Trees and sand were dredged. Red rock was placed on the Goat Road to the west of Lazy River Acres; 7. The Lindy/Santee road has soft spots. Rock and gravel have been put in those areas. Other roads also have problem areas that are being fixed; 8. Verdigre North Bridge WRP issue. Documents were put together to send to Washington, D.C. for approval; 9. Chairman Mackeprang opened the advertised gravel bid opening. County Attorney Thomas met with the Board to discuss the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) that was signed by President Trump and will take effect April 1, 2020 and runs through December 31, 2020. The Act was approved due to the fallout of the COVID-19 virus and requires certain employers to provide their employees with paid sick leave and expanded family and medical leave for specified reasons related to COVID-19. County Attorney Thomas informed the Board that they could apply the date of March 21, 2020 as the start date of FFCRA because that was the date the Board closed the Courthouse to the public except by appointment until further notice due to the COVID-19 virus. Motion by Supr. Liska, seconded by Supr. Borgmann acknowledges the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) H.R. 6201 (2020) was signed by President Trump due to the COVID-19 virus pandemic that runs from April 1 and December 31, 2020 however the Board approves the FFCRA to begin for Knox County on March 21, 2020 and to run through December 31, 2020 as March 21, 2020 was the date the Board closed the Courthouse to the public except by appointment until further notice due to the COVID-19 virus pandemic. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #1. Motion carried.

Sheriff Henery presented a draft of an interlocal agreement for county law enforcement between Knox County and the Village of Niobrara from April 1, 2020 continuing in effect from year to year through June 30, 2023 or until termination. Discussion was held on inventory, employees, contract cost would increase 2.5% each fiscal year and that the Niobrara Village Board will not meet until April 7 to review and possibly adopt the interlocal agreement. Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. Liska to approve the interlocal agreement for County law enforcement between Knox County and the Village of Niobrara from April 1, 2020 through June 30, 2023 or until termination and with the change of item #13 of the interlocal agreement to give the Village of Niobrara’s inventory back when done with the contract, the Niobrara Village vehicle will be returned when the vehicle is no longer needed, and the Village would pay Knox County \$75,270 for the County’s FY2020, \$77,151 for County’s FY 2021, \$79,080 for County’s ~~FY2020~~ FY2022 (corrected 4/9/2020), and

monthly payments of \$6,120 each on April 8, May 15, and June 15, 2020. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #1. Motion carried.

Emergency Manager Hintz updated the Board on the following: 1. Delivered supplies to the Creighton Avera hospital and health clinics in the county; 2. Supplies that had been kept in the storage building from the small pox scare years ago were divided and delivered to the rescue squads and law enforcement in the county; 3. Many conference calls are taking place; 4. Nebraska is able to do 100 tests per day. The North Central District Health Department just posted that the tested sixteen Knox County residents, there were nine tested negative, two positive and three probable; 5. Fifty-nine Nebraska counties, fifty-one cities and the Ponca Tribe have adopted State of Emergency Disaster Declarations; 6. Funeral directors are testing to see what the deceased in their charge died from.

Extension Educator Hanefeldt updated the Board via telephone conference on the following: 1. Construction continues on the walls for the newly created divided office spaces within the main office; 2. Mrs. Hanefeldt is currently working remotely in her home as she cannot come into the office by direction of the University of Nebraska and may be this way for six to eight more weeks; 3. Update on the chick hatching program; 4. The Extension Board is scheduled to hold a meeting on April 7, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. and would have to be held virtually or be cancelled. The Board approved the meeting be held remotely; 5. 4-H has Tuesday and Thursday virtual living room learning sessions at 2:00 p.m. each of these days.

Sheriff Henery is having difficulty making contact with Skyline Healthcare LLC that is shown on the Distress Warrant list. The company is delinquent in paying personal property taxes and Sheriff Henery is attempting to collect the tax or to take the personal property for a sale to pay tax. Sheriff Henery asked the Board if they would want to strike this Distress Warrant. Supr. Schlote will attempt to find a different phone number for the company.

The Board discussed suspending reuse loan principal and interest payments because of the COVID-19 virus fallout. Jeff Christensen with NENEDD had been contacted and he thought the Board would want to consider making the suspension available for all current Knox County loans in general to do whatever it would take to get through this situation. Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Sokol, Jr. to suspend Knox County reuse loan principal and interest payments for four months beginning this date to those reuse loan borrowers who request the suspension due to the COVID-19 virus situation noting that the interest will still accrue but payments won't start again until August 1, 2020 for those who request the suspension and to revisit the matter in four months. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #1. Motion carried.

Zoning Administrator Doerr informed the Board that the April Planning Commission meeting has been postponed.

Discussion was held on Governor Ricketts' Executive Order No. 20-03 Coronavirus Public Meetings Requirement Limited Waiver and options to hold meetings by video-conference, telephonically or by other electronic communications, and, adding more sound equipment in the Board room. While the Board wishes to continue with in-person meetings through the COVID-19 virus situation, some members may not be able to attend due to quarantine or a presenter would not be able to attend due to the 10-person meeting rule. Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Liska to allow meetings to be conducted in person if possible with the 10-person meeting rule during the COVID-19 virus situation and/or by telephonic conferencing, video meeting conferencing if possible, and for public access to the meetings by the same options. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #1. Motion carried.

There was no public comment on agenda items.

Public comment on non-agenda items was given by Sheriff Henery who had a request from Wausa Village with interest in an interlocal agreement for law enforcement similar to the Verdigre Village agreement where the village can still hire their own police chief but the County would provide law enforcement if the police chief or other village law enforcement is not on duty or attending training. The cost would be \$70 per hour.

Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. Borgmann that the receipts totaling \$564,362.77 be accepted and placed on file. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #1. Motion carried.
