

PROCEEDINGS OF THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Center, Nebraska

9:30 a.m.

A regular meeting of the Knox County Board of Supervisors was held in the Boardroom at the Knox County Courthouse in Center, Nebraska on the date of October 29, 2020 at 9:30 a.m. Present were Supervisors Martin J. O'Connor District #1, Patrick J. Liska District #2, Virgil H. Miller District #3, James Sokol, Jr. District #4, Kevin D. Mackeprang District #5, Danny R. Schlote District #6, and James J. Borgmann District #7. Absent was none. Chairman Mackeprang presiding.

Supr. O'Connor led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Mackeprang announced to the public that a copy of the Public Open Meeting Act was posted in the Boardroom.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Wausa Gazette newspaper, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was opened to the attendance of the public.

The minutes of the October 8, 2020 meeting were read and approved by Chairman Mackeprang.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Sokol, Jr. that all claims, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried. Claims totaling \$448,710.93 are listed at the end of these proceedings.

Chairman Mackeprang moves the Board recess at 9:53 a.m. for Board of Equalization.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 10:21 a.m. with all members present.

Hwy. Supt. Barta met with the Board on the following: 1. The report of County Highway Superintendent Barta in regard to the vacation and abandonment of Bass Drive adjoining Lots 3, 4, 5, 8 and 9 in Block A located in Lazy River Acres was brought before the Board. Motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. Borgmann to accept the report of Knox County Highway Superintendent Barta for the vacation and abandonment of Bass Drive adjoining Lots 3,4, 5, 8 and 9 in Block A located in Lazy River Acres, a platted subdivision located in Section 16, T33N, R7W of the 6th P.M., Knox County, Nebraska. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried. Mary Snowdon was present and voiced her concern of the vacation/abandonment of Bass Drive as many people may turn around on their property. Hwy. Supt. Barta said that the people are already turning around now on their property. Mrs. Snowdon said they are having their property surveyed so it can be taken out of the subdivision, and they may have to put up a barbed wire fence or something to block the people from turning around on their property. After discussion, motion by Supr. Liska, seconded by Supr. O'Connor to table setting the hearing on the vacation/abandonment of Bass Drive adjoining Lots 3, 4, 5, 8 and 9 in Block A located in Lazy River Acres until completion of a survey in that area. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 2. Hwy. Supt. Barta applied for NIRMA ASSIST grants for barricade lights and high visibility sweatshirts with hoods; 3. CJ Slide update; 4. Lazy River Acres road update. The Board reviewed a letter submitted by Bruce Curtiss. Supr. Liska said that the Corps of Engineers is doing a feasibility study of the area; 5. Motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. Sandy Stockholm representing the Missouri Sedimentation Action Coalition (MSAC) met with the Board regarding the commitment the Board made previously for \$5,000 to MSAC toward development of a Sediment Management Plan (SMP) with other stakeholders and the anticipated Federal cost share partner, the US Army Corps of Engineers. With Phase 2, MSAC will allocate 38% of Knox County's cost share of \$5,000 or a total of \$1,900 and Phase 3 would be 62% of the \$5,000 for a total of \$3,100. At this time, Phase 2 will be worked on. Motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. Borgmann to commit to the Missouri Sedimentation Action Coalition 38% of Knox County's committed total amount of \$5,000 being \$1,900 for Phase 2 of the Sediment Management Plan and Chairman Mackeprang was authorized to sign a Memorandum of Agreement Between Knox County (NE) and the Missouri Sedimentation Action Coalition, noting that Phase 3 will be worked on at a later date. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Nick Antrobus with Colonial Life Insurance presented information about what the company could offer to employees on a voluntary basis. No action was taken.

Hwy. Supt. Barta continued with the following: 7. Discussed advertising for bids for electrical wiring for the new shed at the Creighton Yard. Sealed electrical bids will be opened at the November 24, 2020 meeting; 8. Discussed new

truck at Niobrara Yard; 9. Update on Cedar/Knox County Line Bridge; 10. Center line striping has been done on over fifty miles of county oil roads. Also discussed costs to paint white lines on county oil roads; 11. Discussed Center West bridge; 12. Discussed the process of purchasing equipment through the SourceWell program that is a Federal group that uses Federal prices, so no bids are needed. Ken Beaudette with Murphy Tractor presented information on a new John Deere Super 772G motorgrader. Trade in would be a 1994 Caterpillar maintainer. Specifications for the new machine were compared to past purchases of John Deere motorgraders. Discussed boosted horsepower, warranty, Premium Circle add-ons at a cost of \$9,500, the discounts through the SourceWell program and the request by the operator to have the capability to open the lower windows. Hwy. Supt. Barta presented the SourceWell program to County Attorney Thomas who approved use of the program. After further discussion, motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. O'Connor to accept the quote from Murphy Tractor through the SourceWell program for a new John Deere Super 772G motorgrader with an extended warranty in the amount of \$319,000 plus \$9,500 for the Premium Circle package and to trade in a used 1994 Caterpillar motorgrader with the trade allowance of \$53,000, making the cost of the new machine \$275,500. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Jean Mackey met with the Board on renewal of the prisoner food contract between Knox County and The Hideout Bar and Grill. Sheriff Henery said the plan has been going smoothly and noted that as per jail standards, the meal plans need to be reviewed by a licensed dietitian. Mrs. Mackey will check with the Avera Creighton Hospital dietitian on the procedure and costs. Motion by Supr. Liska, seconded by Supr. O'Connor to extend the prisoner food contract with Jean and Jim Mackey dba The Hideout Bar and Grill until the next meeting that will be November 12, 2020 to review researched costs of dietitian-reviewed meal plans and inflation costs. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Chairman Mackeprang moves the Board recess at 12:00 p.m. for lunch.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 12:49 p.m. with all members present.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Schlote to go into executive session at 12:49 p.m. so as to protect the reputation of individuals when discussing personnel. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried. Chairman Mackeprang reiterated that the executive session will be held so as to protect the reputation of individuals when discussing personnel. The Board came out of executive session at 1:04 p.m.

Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. Schlote to close at 1:04 p.m. the executive session held on personnel. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Economic Development Director Hanvey met with the Board on a request by the Niobrara State Park Superintendent for a dumpster for duck hunters. Key Sanitation will supply one with similar costs to the deer dumpsters. Motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. Miller to provide a dumpster through Key Sanitation at the Niobrara State Park during duck season into January 2021 with the cost to be \$40 delivery fee plus \$50 per dump with the fees to be paid from the KENO Fund. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Extension Educator Megan Hanefeldt and Extension Board President Holly Wortmann met with the Board regarding restructuring of the Extension Office. There are currently two County-paid part-time office staff working in the Knox County Extension Office and one will be retiring the end of December 2020. Discussion ensued on 377 traditional 4-H members in Knox County and the need to have a 4-H Assistant who can work with the traditional members and non-traditional youth such as in schools, youth development programs, etc.; the University of Nebraska Cooperative Extension would provide a 1.0 FTE Extension Assistant whose responsibilities would include planning, coordinating, managing and evaluating the day-to-day tasks associated with conducting the 4-H program; the assistant would be a contract employee of the University with Knox County reimbursing the University for wages and benefits; the assistant would report to Educator Hanefeldt who would also evaluate the person and provide that information to the Knox County Extension Board; the County would only pay for hours worked and would be billed quarterly; the amount of the agreement, to begin on the hire date, will be determined by the minimum annual salary for the Extension Assistant as set by the University of Nebraska Board of Regents in the amount of approximately \$35,816 at this time plus the County would pay the benefit cost of approximately \$17,000; no anticipated wage increase at this time as there is a wage-freeze at the University level; and the remaining part-time office staff would go to full-time starting January 1, 2021. Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Sokol, Jr. to approve a 4-H Extension Assistant through the University of Nebraska as per the University of Nebraska Cooperative Extension Division and Knox County Supplement to the Interlocal Agreement, the assistant to be a contract employee of the University, Knox County to reimburse the University of Nebraska for the hours worked by the assistant that would be approximately \$35,816 annually, Knox County to reimburse the University of Nebraska for the assistant's benefit package that would be approximately 50% of the annual wage, and long-time office employee Amy Johnson will remain part-time until January 1, 2021 when she will be changed to full-time status. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to place on file the Revenue Receipts List from October 8 to October 28, 2020. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. Miller to adopt **Resolution #2020 – 30** as an Amendment and Addendum to NIRMA/NIRMA II Intergovernmental/Interlocal Agreements and extending Knox County's commitment to participating in NIRMA and NIRMA II for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2024. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

**RESOLUTION #2020 – 30
FOR AMENDMENT AND ADDENDUM TO
NIRMA/NIRMA II INTERGOVERNMENTAL/INTERLOCAL AGREEMENTS**

WHEREAS, Knox County has previously entered into Intergovernmental/Interlocal Agreements with various other Nebraska Counties and other public agencies to form and participate in the Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Association (NIRMA) and the Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Association II (NIRMA II) as authorized by the Intergovernmental Risk Management Act (Neb. Rev. Stat. §44-4301 et seq.) and the Nebraska Interlocal Cooperation Act (Neb. Rev. Stat. §13-801et seq.); and

WHEREAS, Counties and other Public Agencies as defined in Neb. Rev. Stat. §44-4303 are allowed to participate in said cooperative undertakings; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has found that proper risk management requires the spreading of risk so as to minimize fluctuation in insurance needs and that benefits can be derived through the pooling of insurance purchasing by local government, and

WHEREAS, NIRMA and NIRMA II have provided coverages to the County in a cost effective way which meet and exceed that provided by standard insurance carriers; and

WHEREAS, NIRMA and NIRMA II provide risk management services such as loss prevention, safety, audits, claims and litigation management, and coverages tailored to address loss exposures counties and other related public entities face not economically available from other sources; and

WHEREAS, these coverages and risk management services are essential for the continued effective and efficient use of county taxpayer dollars; and

WHEREAS, the current Intergovernmental/Interlocal Agreements will expire on June 30, 2021, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Knox County Board hereby:

1. Extends its commitment to participate in NIRMA and NIRMA II for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2024; and
2. Declares that the Resolution shall serve as an amendment and addendum to the previous Intergovernmental/Interlocal Agreements entered into by the County Board, said Intergovernmental/Interlocal Agreements readopted by and incorporated herein by this reference as amended.

County Clerk Fischer updated the Board on a Special Designated License that she approved for The Hideout Bar & Grill for an event at The Barn (God's Country) on November 7, 2020. The Application Form 200 was due to the Liquor Control Commission prior to the Board meeting so as it was a special circumstance, County Clerk Fischer had the authority to allow or disallow the application.

The Board discussed the COVID 19 procedures in place at this time and no changes were made.

The Board had instructed County Clerk Fischer to send emails to the County school superintendents to ask if their respective schools would consider holding the 2021 Knox County Spelling Bee as there was concern of social distancing availability in the Knox County Courtroom. County Clerk Fischer said Superintendent Margaret Sandoz at the Niobrara Public School responded and said they would hold the County Spelling Bee. Motion by Supr. Liska, seconded by Supr. Schlote to hold the 2021 Knox County Spelling Bee at the Niobrara Public School Gymnasium on February 17, 2021 and thanked Niobrara School Superintendent Margaret Sandoz for the offer to use their facilities. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Emergency Manager Hintz met with the Board on the following: 1. It is time for the annual job evaluation of Emergency Manager Hintz and a copy of last year's appraisal was handed out to the Board; 2. Update is needed on the Local Emergency Operations Plan. A committee was formed to discuss hazardous material storage and transportation of hazardous materials through communities and counties; 3. Discussed updating the Hazard Mitigation Plans; 4. Knox, Pierce and Holt Counties are now in the "orange" zone for recent increases in COVID-19 cases.

Zoning Administrator Doerr met with the Board via telephone conference: 1. Motion by Supr. Borgmann, seconded by Supr. Liska to approve Administrative Plat Application #P0159 Dan Wamberg for a zoning lot combination of Lots 15 and 16 in Grandview Estates Subdivision. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 2. Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to approve Administrative Plat Application #P0161 Dean and Stephanie Stueckrath for correcting a boundary adjustment because of a fence line on the W1/2W1/2NE1/4 of Section 7, T30N, R3W of the 6th P.M., Knox County, Nebraska. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 3. Motion by Supr. Liska, seconded by Supr. Miller to approve Administrative Plat Application #P0163 Lou Wiltse for a zoning lot combination of Lots 378 and 379, Block 2, Devils Nest Subdivision. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 4. Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Sokol, Jr. to approve Administrative Plat Application #P0164 Don and Jolene Wisnieski on a boundary adjustment of Outlot 45, Hideaway Acres Outlots. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 5. Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to approve

Administrative Plat Application #P0165 Carolyn Mass for a zoning lot combination of Lots 1, 2 and parts of Lots 3 and 4, Block D, Lazy River Acres Subdivision. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 6. Discussed costs of updating the regulations. Consultant Keith Marvin has been working on the comprehensive plan updates and is ready to begin the lake area updates. Supr. O'Connor said that a committee should be formed comprised of a Planning Commission member, the Zoning Administrator, the County Assessor, and he so they could review the lake area regulations with Consultant Marvin via Zoom before continuing. Further discussion was held on campgrounds as some do not have authority to allow people to install decks and/or awnings on their campers that are parked in the areas for extended times, possible setbacks in the campgrounds, licensing of the campers, enforcement, and the need to begin the review of the campground regulations now.

There was no public comment on agenda items. Public comment on non-agenda items was given by Supr. Sokol, Jr. who recently attend a Northeast RC&D meeting.

The Board made a quarterly visit to the Knox County Jail as per Neb. Rev. Stat. §47-109.
