

## PROCEEDINGS OF THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Center, Nebraska  
March 11, 2021  
9:30 a.m.

A regular meeting of the Knox County Board of Supervisors was held in the Boardroom at the Knox County Courthouse in Center, Nebraska on the date of March 11, 2021 at 9:30 a.m. Present were Supervisors Martin J. O'Connor District #1, Patrick J. Liska District #2, Virgil H. Miller District #3, Kevin D. Mackeprang District #5, Danny R. Schlote District #6, and James J. Borgmann District #7. Absent was Supervisor James Sokol, Jr. District #4. Chairman Mackeprang presiding.

Supr. Liska led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Mackeprang announced to the public that a copy of the Public Open Meeting Act was posted in the Boardroom.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Bloomfield Monitor newspaper, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was opened to the attendance of the public.

The minutes of the February 25, 2021 meeting were read and approved by Chairman Mackeprang.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Borgmann that all claims audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent District #4. Motion carried. Claims totaling \$397,779.82 are listed at the end of these proceedings.

Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to place on file the County Treasurer's Return of Sale Proceedings certifying that on March 1, 2021 all delinquent real estate taxes were offered for public auction, the public tax sale is now closed and the private tax sale began and will continue from day to day until all said land has been offered. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent District #4. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to place on file the Receipts Revenue List from February 25 through March 10, 2021. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent District #4. Motion carried.

Chairman Mackeprang moves the Board recess at 9:57 a.m. for Board of Equalization.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 10:07 a.m. with all members present except Supr. James Sokol, Jr., District #4.

Antelope County Commissioner Dean Smith, Antelope Road Supt. Aaron Boggs, JEO representative Brian McDonald and Road employee Casey Diettrich met with the Board to discuss a bridge on the Antelope/Knox County line where the east abutment was washed out by the 2019 flood. Discussion continued on repairing the bridge compared to replacement, FEMA funds allotted with Knox County and Antelope County splitting the costs of approximately \$14,500, some property owners in the area have land lock as the bridge is not open, the road is a low volume road, possibility of putting in a narrower bridge, and the need for an interlocal agreement. Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to approve the replacement of a truss bridge on the Antelope/Knox County line, the counties to split the remaining costs after FEMA pays 75% and NEMA pays 12.5%, the replacement bridge to be a 24 ft. x 150 ft. bridge and Antelope and Knox Counties enter into an interlocal agreement for the project. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent District #4. Motion carried.

Tyler Wolf with Nebraska Game and Parks met with the Board to discuss mowing of the Rec Road. The Nebraska Game and Parks will continue mowing their frontage areas. Mr. Wolf said that adjacent landowners are supposed to mow the road sides but that isn't going to happen as not everyone lives here. Also, he added that it is a liability and risk for the Nebraska Game and Parks if they continue to mow the road sides. Discussion was held on options of possibly hiring someone to mow the road or the County renting a tractor and purchasing a mower so the County could mow the road. More research will be done.

Travis Barney met with the Board regarding the approach road to his proposed subdivision/development. Also present was Herrick Township Clerk Rick Stewart. The .30-mile road leading into the area is currently a Herrick Township minimum maintenance road. Discussion ensued on getting the road back to standard for local classification, maintenance of the road currently has been done by Herrick Township and Frankfort Township, adding rock to the base and pulling in the shoulders of the road, process to reclassify the road, maintenance of the roads/streets in the proposed subdivision that will also be located in Frankfort and North Frankfort Townships, a homeowner association will be formed, and Herrick Township doesn't have the money or budget to fix the road. Mr. Barney said he would fix the road and would take care of the snow removal, but he would have to have the tax benefit/tax dollars if the township won't do it with the same condition on the roads/streets in the subdivision that lays across the three townships. Herrick Township Clerk Stewart said that Herrick Township has a gentleman's agreement that the tax money the township receives from the Kohles Acres subdivision is given back to the subdivision as it maintains the roads/streets within the subdivision. Further discussion was held on the possibility of the County winging the snow at the entrance and that an agreement is needed from the three townships regarding the funds and road maintenance.

At 11:15 a.m., Chairman Mackeprang opened the advertised public hearing on Amended Conditional Use Permit #CU0040A for Wolf Run Resort.

Tom Domanski with the Nebraska Department of Revenue met with the Board to discuss campers situated for extended periods of time at campgrounds in the lake area. Discussion was held on the following: people are buying large campers and parking them in the leased campground lots with many not registered with the County Treasurer; non-payment of taxes or annual registrations; people are pouring concrete, building lean-tos or decks, a bar, a porch and other additions that are not being taxed; there is an increase of campgrounds/RV parks subdivisions in the lake area; that the camper must be titled where it has situs for the majority of the year; who would be in charge of enforcement; that campground owners should possibly include in their leases that all campers must be registered and licensed annually with the County Treasurer; possibly taxing the landowners who lease campground areas; types of campers; classification if the campers are considered real estate if situated for extended times; dated photos could be taken to show if campers are parked for more than thirty days; and sending letters to explain the law. Mr. Domanski said that he will discuss the matter with the Department of Revenue so assistance can be given to the County.

Chairman Mackeprang closed the open public hearing at 11:58 a.m. There was no one present in opposition. Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to adopt **Resolution #2021 - 04** approving Conditional Use Permit #CU0040A Wolf Run RV Resort for the additional six campsites for a total of 40 campsites which will now extend into the E1/2NE1/4 of Section 19, T33N, R2W of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Knox County, Nebraska and that the Planning Commission's recommended conditions are approved. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent District #4. Motion carried.

### **RESOLUTION #2021 - 04**

**WHEREAS**, Wolf Run RV Resort (John D. & Jodi K. Aschoff) have applied for Conditional Use Permit #CU0040 to add phase 2 (34 RV sites) to the Wolf Run RV Resort on part of the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 18, Township 33 North, Range 2 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Knox County, Nebraska, which was approved December 31, 2020 and,

**WHEREAS**, Wolf Run RV Resort (John D. & Jodi K. Aschoff) have applied for an amendment to add an additional six campsites for a total of 40 campsites which will now extend into the East 1/2 of the Northeast 1/4 of Section 19, Township 33 North, Range 2 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Knox County, Nebraska,

**WHEREAS**, the Knox County Planning Commission has given public notice and held a public hearing on February 9, 2021

**WHEREAS**, the Knox County Planning Commission has found that the application complies with the Knox County Zoning Regulations, and hereby makes a recommendation to approve the permit with the following conditions:

1. Each campsite shall be plainly marked with a map of such numbers provided to the Zoning Administrator.
2. Each campsite shall have two parking stalls.
3. All access drives and parking areas shall be surfaced with gravel, asphalt or other material to free the site of mud.
4. The campground shall be compliant with all Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy and Nebraska Health & Human Services standards.
5. All campers shall be licensed and road ready. Any campers stored on site after 4 months shall be in a stored state with slideouts slid in.
6. No porches, decks, additions or storage sheds, etc. will be allowed until such time that the Zoning Regulations are amended to allow it.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS** that the Wolf Run RV Resort (John D. & Jodi K. Aschoff) Conditional Use Permit #CU0040A be approved.

Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Liska to place on file the February Zoning Permits Report. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent District #4. Motion carried.

Chairman Mackeprang moves the Board recess for lunch at 12:01 p.m.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 12:36 p.m. with all members present except Supervisor James Sokol, Jr. District #4.

Hwy. Supt. Barta met with the Board on the following: 1. Prischman Bridge Repair Bridge FEMA project. The Board discussed the bid tabulations and the price differences from the bid opening held at the February 25, 2021 meeting. Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to accept the low bid of **Dixon Construction Co., Correctionville IA 51016** in the amount of \$370,319 with a start date of June 1 and an end date of July 31, 2021 with the contingency of a Corps Permit and the approval of an improved project by FEMA/NEMA. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent District #4. Motion carried; 2. Garage door quotes for Verdigre Shed. Quotes received were: **Overhead Door Company of Norfolk** - \$3,697.00; **Warren Garage Door, Inc., Norfolk**, - \$4,354.00; **Schreier's Lumber Co., Verdigre** - \$4,195 for door and operator. Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. Liska to accept the bid from Overhead Door Company of Norfolk in the amount of \$3,697.00 for an overhead garage door for the Verdigre Shed noting that the other doors in the Verdigre Shed are from the Overhead Door Company. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent District #4. Motion carried; 3. Discussed crushed concrete and asphalt patch material; 4. The gravel bid opening will be held at the ~~April 8~~ **March 23, 2021** (corrected 3-25-2021) meeting.

Noxious Weed Supt. Banks met with the Board to discuss replacing the current weed pickup. Supt. Banks said that he needs a pickup with an eight-foot box so the sprayer can go into it, the current pickup has over 200,000 miles on it, he drives about 20,000 miles each year, and that a 4-wheel drive pickup is needed. Discussion was held on available pickups at the County sheds and replacements.

Bruce and Mary Hagge met with the Board about getting a building permit for their property in the Devils Nest. Currently no building permits are being issued in the Devils Nest subdivision. Discussion was held on County regulations, court rulings, and updating declarations and covenants in the subdivision. No action was taken.

Extension Educator Megan Hanefeldt updated the Board on youth programs and new 4-H Assistant Kristine Kumm will begin working May 10.

There was no public comment on agenda items.

Comment on non-agenda items was given by Sheriff Henery on a law enforcement agreement draft with the Village of Wausa. The Village's risk management company and NIRMA will be contacting each other to go over the conditions.

Deputy County Attorney Holecek and the Board discussed implementation of new software in the County Attorney's Office so it can conduct paperless business and starting new truancy programs with the schools as well as participating in more programs in the office. The current office clerk who was a part-time employee has resigned. The County Attorney's Office had been open three days a week and Deputy Holecek said that the position now needs to be a fulltime position due to the new implementations. Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Chairman Mackeprang that the office clerk position in the County Attorney's Office become a full-time position. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent District #4. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Liska, seconded by Supr. Miller to go into executive session at 1:40 p.m. to conduct job interviews with selected applicants for the custodian position. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent District #4. Motion carried. Chairman Mackeprang reiterated that the executive session will be held for applicant interviews for the custodian position. The Board came out of executive session at 2:13 p.m.

Motion by Supr. Borgmann, seconded by Supr. Liska to close at 2:13 p.m. the executive session held on applicant interviews for the custodian position. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #4. Motion carried.

Supr. Borgmann left at 2:14 p.m.

Emergency Manager Hintz met with the Board on the following: 1. Tri-County Mitigation Plan update. Holt County and Antelope County Boards have approved JEO Consulting Group, Inc. for making the updates. A BRIC grant is being applied for that would pay for 75% of the update costs with the three counties to divide and pay the remainder costs. Knox County's approximate cost would be \$7,083. Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Miller to approve JEO Consulting Group, Inc. to prepare the updates to the Tri-County Mitigation Plan that includes Knox, Holt and Antelope Counties. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5 and #6. Nays none. Absent were Districts #4 and District #7. Motion carried; 2. Update on COVID-19. There are currently seventeen positive cases of COVID-19 variants in Nebraska that includes seven cases of the B117 (UK) variant and one case of the California variant; 3. The overall flood risk is normal because of low moisture.

After a discussion, motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Liska to adopt to **Resolution #2021 - 05** declaring that the Knox County Board of Supervisors supports the right and liberties of all Knox County citizens guaranteed by the United States and Nebraska Constitutions and further affirms its support for the duly elected Sheriff of Knox County and his continuing efforts to uphold those Constitutions. yes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5 and #6. Nays none. Absent were District #4 and District #7. Motion carried

#### **RESOLUTION #2021 - 05**

**WHEREAS**, the Second amendment to the United States Constitution provides that it is the right of the people to keep and bear arms, and that right shall not be infringed; and

**WHEREAS**, Article I, Section 1-1 of the Nebraska Constitution also provides the right to keep and bear arms, specifically “for security or defense of self, family, home, and others, and for lawful common defense, hunting, recreational use, and all other lawful purposes,” and all provides that such right shall not be infringed; and,

**WHEREAS**, the United States Supreme Court in the District of Columbia v. Heller, 554 U.S. 570 (2008) affirmed an individual’s right to possess firearms, unconnected with service in a militia, for traditionally lawful purposes, such as self-defense within the home; and,

**WHEREAS**, it is the desire of the Knox County Board of Supervisors to declare its support of the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution and Article I, Section 1-1 of the Nebraska Constitution; and

**WHEREAS**, the members of the Knox County Board of Supervisors took an oath to support and defend the United States, and Nebraska Constitutions.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Knox County Board of Supervisors hereby declares that we support the rights and liberties of all Knox County citizens guaranteed by the United States and Nebraska Constitutions.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this Board affirms its support for the duly elected Sheriff of Knox County, Nebraska, and his continuing efforts to uphold the United States and Nebraska Constitutions.
