

PROCEEDINGS OF THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

A regular meeting of the Knox County Board of Supervisors was held in the Boardroom at the Knox County Courthouse in Center, Nebraska on the date of Thursday, October 14, 2021 at 9:30 a.m. Present were, Supervisors Martin J. O'Connor District #1, Virgil H. Miller District #3, James Sokol, Jr. District #4, Kevin D. Mackeprang District #5, Danny R. Schlote District #6, and James J. Borgmann District #7. Absent was Supervisor Patrick J. Liska District #2. Chairman Mackeprang presiding.

Supr. Schlote led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Mackeprang announced to the public that a copy of the Public Open Meeting Act was posted in the Boardroom.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Bloomfield Monitor newspaper, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was opened to the attendance of the public.

The minutes of the September 30, 2021 meeting were read and approved by Chairman Mackeprang.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Miller that all claims, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #2. Motion carried. Claims totaling \$854,472.84 are listed at the end of these proceedings.

Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to acknowledge County Treasurer Ebel's appointment of Susan Beckman as the Deputy County Treasurer. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #2. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to place on file the County Sheriff's Quarterly Fee Report of Fees Collected between July 1 through September 30, 2021. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #2. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. Schlote to place on file the Receipts Revenue List from September 30 through October 13, 2021. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #2. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. Borgmann to place on file the Clerk of District Court September Fee Report. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #2. Motion carried.

Chairman Mackeprang moves the Board recess at 10:01 a.m. for Board of Equalization.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 10:31 a.m. with all members present except Supervisor Patrick J. Liska, District 2.

Hwy. Supt. Barta met with the Board on the following: 1. Shed inventory forms were given to each Supervisor for their respective road employees to complete; 2. Discussed winter motorgrader routes. The Road and Bridge Committee will meet Tuesday to discuss the routes; 3. Oil Crew update; 4. Bridge Crew update; 5. The FEMA Walton bridge bid opening will be held at the October 28, 2021 meeting; 6. Weigand bridge update. A larger deck plate is needed. It may be possible that the bridge will be shut down to one lane. Discussion ensued on a shoefly and a detour that would mean fifteen extra miles on dangerous roads; 7. Discussed turning the Rec Road back to the State; 8. Waiting for the State to pay 80% of the work done on the CJ slide; 9. Prischman bridge update; 10. Verdigre North federal aid project update; 11. Supr. Liska and Hwy. Supt. Barta attended a WebEx meeting regarding Corps of Engineers project of dredging the Ponca Creek in the Lazy River Acres area.

Chairman opened at 10:55 a.m. the public hearing on the Santee Sioux Nation dba Featherhill Express Class D Liquor License Application. Discussion was held on the proposed license area. Interim Business Manager Waylon LaPlante was called and he volunteered to come to the meeting to answer any questions. Further discussion was put on hold until Mr. LaPlante arrives.

Chairman Mackeprang opened at 11:05 a.m. the public hearing on Conditional Use Permit #CU0046 HESK LLC. for construction of a duplex. Chairman Mackeprang closed the public hearing at 11:12 a.m. No one was present in opposition. Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to adopt **Resolution #2021 - 40** approving Conditional Use Permit #CU0046 HESK LLC for construction of a duplex on a portion of the SW1/4 of Section 14, T33N, R3W of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Knox County, Nebraska. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #2. Motion carried.

3. Under the soffit lighting shall be included on the west side of the new structure.
4. Applicant shall show compliance of diversion of water before construction begins.
5. Permanent diversion of water shall be installed during construction and in the future to control the runoff.

Chairman Mackeprang opened at 11:17 a.m. the public hearing on the Final Plat of Vested Holdings Subdivision located in Peoria Township. Craig Braunsroth was present. Zoning Administrator Doerr said the plat could be used as a survey and not as creating a separate subdivision. Chairman Mackeprang closed the public hearing at 11:22 a.m. No one was present in opposition. Motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. Schlote to approve the Final Plat of Vested Holdings Subdivision located in a part of the East 540 feet of the North 1,252 feet of the SE1/4 of Section 9, T31N, R3W of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Knox County, Nebraska and that this will not be a separate subdivision, so no Subdivision Agreement is needed. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #2. Motion carried.

Chairman Mackeprang opened at 11:23 a.m. a public hearing on campground regulations. Supr. O'Connor requested that no action be taken as Supr. Liska was absent and that at this time additional time is needed to review the changes that would affect Supr. Liska's District as well as Supr. O'Connor's District. Discussion was held on the RV regulations, changes, taxing landowners for the improvements such as patios, decks, and concrete by the campers. Chairman Mackeprang recessed the public hearing until the October 28, 2021 meeting.

Santee Sioux Nation Interim Business Manager Waylon LaPlante arrived to answer questions regarding the Santee Sioux Nation dba Featherhill Express Liquor License Application. The Board asked what area will be covered by the license and Mr. LaPlante said the 20-foot x 26-foot building would be the only area licensed. Also, the Board asked about the time of liquor sales as the Featherhill Express is open twenty-four hours a day. Mr. LaPlante said they would follow the State's regulations that all liquor sales would end at 1:00 a.m. Also, as per the Santee Sioux Nation resolution, liquor sales would start again at 6:00 a.m. Mr. LaPlante updated the Board on the training given to beverage servers and attendants. Sheriff Henery informed the Board that the casino works with his office if someone is intoxicated and should not drive. Chairman Mackeprang closed the public hearing at 11:47 a.m. Motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. Miller to approve the Santee Sioux Nation dba Featherhill Express Class D Liquor License Application with the licensed area to only be the 20-foot x 26-foot building and that no sales of alcohol shall be made from 1 a.m. through 6 a.m. daily. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #2. Motion carried.

Emergency Manager Hintz met with the Board on the following: 1. Presentation of information on the Missouri River Northeast Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) that was originally prepared in 2015 covering Cedar, Dakota, Dixon, and Knox Counties. The Nebraska Forest Service (NFS) is launching an update for the plan over the next several months and requested the Board designate an individual to participate on the Steering Committee to help with the update to ensure that pertinent changes are included in the plan and that local issues remain front and center. Emergency Manager Hintz said that she had been involved in the past. The Board designated Emergency Manager Hintz to participate on the Steering Committee for the CWPP updates; 2. Update on increasing positive cases of COVID-19 in the County as well as the health districts. Discussion was held on a third vaccine shot and the booster vaccine shot; 3. Update on the wastewater bus tour that Emergency Manager Hintz and Zoning Administrator Doerr took part in several weeks ago. Knox County and Boyd County sites were visited.

Zoning Administrator Doerr met with the Board on the following: 1. Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to place on file the September Permits Report. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #2. Motion carried; 2. Discussed new template land use chart that Consultant Keith Marvin is using in Antelope County.

Chairman Mackeprang moves the Board recess at 12:05 p.m.

Discussion was held on minimum lot sizes in the Commercial Corridor District, DEQ approval is needed for tracts less than three acres and that a platted subdivision in that area has lots that are one-half acres. Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to request Consultant Keith Marvin to review changing the minimum lot size in the Commercial Corridor District south of Hwy. 54. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #2. Motion carried.

SLFRF Administrator Nix updated the Board on the Applied Connective Technologies quotes and proposals for installing a sound system and larger television screens in the Board Room and the Basement Conference Room. Applied Connective Technologies will be contacted for more information and a possible demonstration.

Sokol, Jr. to approve KENO operation under the County's KENO's jurisdiction to Creighton Community Country Club Inc. dba as Creighton Community Country Club. By roll call vote. Committee update was given by Deputy County Clerk Surface on the costs of the recent concrete repairs.

Officials' update was given by Deputy County Attorney Holecek who informed the Board of the SID #2 court case and recent SID #2 election. Also, Corrie Key is the new Administrative Assistant in the County Attorney's Office.

There was not public comment on agenda items nor on non-agenda items.

Motion by Supr. Sokol, seconded by Supr. O'Connor to go into executive session at 1:49 p.m. so as to protect the reputation of an individual when discussing personnel. By roll call vote. Chairman Mackeprang reiterated the executive session will be held so as to protect the reputation of an individual when discussing personnel. The Board came out of executive session at 2:03 p.m.
