

PROCEEDINGS OF THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Center, Nebraska
October 28, 2021
9:30 a.m.

A regular meeting of the Knox County Board of Supervisors was held in the Boardroom at the Knox County Courthouse in Center, Nebraska on the date of October 28, 2021 at 9:30 a.m. Present were Supervisors Martin J. O'Connor District #1, Patrick J. Liska District #2, Virgil H. Miller District #3, James Sokol, Jr. District #4, Kevin D. Mackeprang District #5, Danny R. Schlote District #6, and James J. Borgmann District #7. Absent was none.

Supr. Miller led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Mackeprang announced to the public that a copy of the Public Open Meeting Act was posted in the Boardroom.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Verdigre Eagle newspaper, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was opened to the attendance of the public.

The minutes of the October 14, 2021 meeting were read and approved by Chairman Mackeprang.

Correspondence reviewed was: 1. Thank you card from former County Treasurer Cathy Stark.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Sokol, Jr. that all claims, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried. Claims totaling \$312,682.86 are listed at the end of these proceedings.

Chairman Mackeprang moves the Board recess at 10:05 a.m. for Board of Equalization.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 10:18 a.m. with all members present.

Hwy. Supt. Barta met with the Board on the following: 1. Bridge Crew update; 2. Oil Crew update; 3. Bridge inspections done by the County are now completed as well as Speece Lewis Engineering has completed the inspections of the fracture critical bridges; 4. Center line painting may be completed next week depending on the weather; 5. Crofton truck snowplow operator ad was printed in papers recently; 6. Mechanic Crosley asked to purchase a portable bead breaker as he fixes motorgrader and truck tires. The approximate cost is \$1,800. For Mechanic Crosley's safety, the Board said to purchase the portable bead breaker; 7. Kreg Mitteis said he may be adding 50 cents a yard to his gravel bid due to higher fuel costs; 8. Discussion was held on contracting propane due to projected cost increases.

At 10:32 a.m., Chairman Mackeprang opened the advertised public hearing on the vacation/abandonment of the right-of-way adjacent to Lot 13 in Stewart's Prairie Ridge.

At 10:32 a.m., the advertised bid opening was held for the construction of a 130-foot, three-span continuous concrete slab bridge on a zero-degree skew and other related incidental work on the Verdigre Southwest, C005402505P bridge project. The Knox County Board of Supervisors reserves the right to reject any and all bids or to waive any irregularities in bids received. Award of the Contract will be in accordance with the County Purchasing Act's competitive bidding considerations set forth in Nebraska Revised Statute §23-3110 to §23-3114. Knox County is an Equal Opportunity Employer. Bids were opened in the order they were received: **Herbst Construction, Inc., LeMars IA**, \$749,734, start date - November 29, 2021, end date - 90 working days; **Dixon Construction, Correctionville IA**, \$819,849, start date - May 2, 2022, end date - August 31, 2022 (will need 121 calendar days to complete); **KEA Constructors, LLC, Milford NE**, \$889,380.10, start date - November 15, 2021, end date - 95 working days; **JJK Construction, LLC, Ceresco NE**, \$801,478.53, start date - November 15, 2021, end date - 95 calendar days after beginning work; **Simon Contractors, North Platte NE**, \$954,725, start date - March 27, 2022, end date - June 30, 2022. Motion by Supr. Borgmann, seconded by Supr. Miller to take no action on this date and to review the bids again at the November 23, 2021 meeting. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. O'Connor to go into executive session at 10:50 a.m. so as to protect the reputation of an individual when discussing personnel. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried. Chairman Mackeprang reiterated that the executive session will be held so as to protect the reputation of an individual when discussing personnel. The Board came out of executive session at 11:10 a.m.

Motion by Supr. Liska, seconded by Supr. Schlote to close at 11:10 a.m. the executive session held on personnel. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Nick Antrobus with Colonial Life insurance presented information on dental/vision insurance. The Board took no action and will review the information.

Ryan Robinson with Applied Connective Technologies met with the Board via Microsoft Teams to demonstrate components of a proposed sound system with new larger Smart television screens. Also discussed was new software, someone could bring their own device to make a presentation by using the Smart televisions and software, possibility of recording hearings, livestream meetings, and set up through Facebook or YouTube as for Covid-19 matters.

Zoning Administrator Doerr met with the Board on the following: 1. At 11:30 a.m. the Board continued the public hearing from the October 14, 2021 meeting regarding RV campground regulation changes. Discussion was held on licensing RVs in the campground; 2. Motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. Miller to approve Administrative Plat Application #P0184 Mike Zerbe on the 5.94-acre tract split in the SE1/4NE1/4 and NE1/4SE1/4 in Section 8, T29N, R7W of the 6th P.M., Knox County, Nebraska. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 3. There will be no Planning Commission meeting in November.

Chairman Mackeprang moves the Board recess at 12:08 p.m. for lunch.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 12:35 p.m. with all members present.

The Board made a quarterly visit to the Knox County Jail as per Nebraska Revised Statute 47-109.

The Board discussed redistricting of the Supervisor Districts according to the 2020 U.S. Census. The Board met with gWorks via Microsoft Teams to review options so to be in compliance with Federal laws. Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to adopt **Resolution #2021 – 42** approving and adopting Proposal Map #9 outlining the new Knox County Supervisor Districts created by gWorks using the 2020 U.S. Census population numbers where the Santee Sioux Nation Reservation will be entirely in Supervisor District #2, the Northern Ponca Tribal Areas will be entirely in Supervisor District #4, that the Supervisor Districts were evenly divided in population falling between the variance of 5% above or below of the target number, there are no more than two Supervisor Districts in a voting precinct, that census blocks were not divided between two Supervisor Districts, the Supervisor Districts were contiguous, and the newly adopted Knox County Supervisor Districts are effective for candidates to file beginning January 5, 2022. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION #2021 – 42

WHEREAS, redistricting of the Knox County Supervisor Districts was necessary after the 2020 U.S. Census results were released, and

WHEREAS, the Santee Sioux Nation Reservation in Harrison, Hill, Spade and Union Townships and the Northern Ponca Tribal Areas in the Niobrara and Raymond Townships are too large in population to be in one Supervisor District, and

WHEREAS, the Santee Sioux Nation Reservation should be entirely in one Supervisor District, and

WHEREAS, the Northern Ponca Tribal Areas in Niobrara and Raymond Townships should be entirely in one Supervisor District, and

WHEREAS, the Supervisor Districts shall be equal in population, the target population of each District is computed by dividing the total Knox County population as per the 2020 U.S. Census of 8,391 between the seven Supervisor Districts for a target number of 1,199 persons per District, there cannot be a variance of more than 5% above or below the target amount, there can be no more than two Supervisor Districts in one voting precinct and a census block cannot be divided between two Supervisor Districts, and

WHEREAS, the Supervisor Districts should be as contiguous as possible, and

WHEREAS, gWorks using the 2020 U.S. Census data has worked with the Knox County Clerk and the Knox County Board of Supervisors extensively for numbers to produce fair and correct Supervisor Districts, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the attached Proposal #9 map is approved and adopted as the Knox County Supervisor Districts effective for candidates to file beginning January 5, 2022 with the Supervisor District boundaries to be revised as follows:

1. The boundaries of Supervisor District #1 of Knox County, Nebraska include the following described territory: Sections 1 through 16, Sections 23 and 24, that portion of Section 25 lying north of Knox Avenue and south of Highway 12, and the incorporated City of Crofton located in parts of Sections 24, 25 and 26 in Eastern Township; all of Frankfort Township; and all of North Frankfort Township. District #1 contains 1,166 persons more or less according to the 2020 Census of population by the United States Census Bureau. All of District #1 is in the voting precinct of Crofton Area.
2. The boundaries of Supervisor District #2 of Knox County, Nebraska include the following described territory: All of Addison Township; all of Harrison Township; all of Herrick Township; all of Hill Township including the incorporated Village of Santee; Sections 13 through 36 of Niobrara Township lying south of Highway 12 **LESS** the incorporated Village of Niobrara located in Sections 16 and 17; all of Spade Township; and all of Union Township. The Santee Sioux Nation Reservation will be entirely in District #2. District #2 contains 1,223 persons more or less according to the 2020 Census of population by the United States Census Bureau. Addison, Harrison, Herrick, Hill, Spade and Union Townships are located in the newly redistricted voting precinct of Lindy/Santee/Center Area. Sections 13 through 36 of Niobrara Township lying south of Highway 12 **LESS** the incorporated Village of Niobrara located in Sections 16 and 17 is located in the newly redistricted voting precinct of Niobrara Area.
3. The boundaries of Supervisor District #3 of Knox County, Nebraska include the following described territory: All of Central Township; all of Cleveland Township; Sections 1 through 18, Sections 23 through 26, and Sections 35 and 36 in Creighton Township including the incorporated Village of Bazile Mills; all of Jefferson Township; all of Logan Township; all of Miller Township including the incorporated Village of Winnetoon; Sections 6 through 8 and Sections 16 through 36 in Morton Township; all of Valley Township including the incorporated Village of Center; Sections 7 and 8 lying south of 881 RD, Sections 9 through 12 south of Highway 84 and all of Sections 13 through 36 in Verdigre Township **LESS** the incorporated Village of Verdigre; all of Walnut Grove Township; all of Washington Township; and all of Western Township. District #3 contains 1,155 persons more or less according to the 2020 Census of population by the United States Census Bureau. Central and Valley Townships are located in the newly redistricted voting precinct of Lindy/Santee/Center Area. Cleveland Township is located in the newly redistricted voting precinct of Wausa Area. Sections 6 through 8 and Sections 16 through 36 in Morton Township are located in the voting precinct of Bloomfield Area. Sections 1 through 18, Sections 23 through 26,

and Sections 35 and 36 in Creighton Township including the incorporated Village of Bazile Mills are located in the newly redistricted voting precinct of Creighton Area. All of Jefferson, Logan, Miller including the incorporated Village of Winnetoon, Walnut Grove, Washington and Western Townships, and, Sections 7 and 8 lying south of 881 RD and Sections 9 through 12 lying south of Highway 84 and all Sections 13 through 36 in Verdigre Township **LESS** the incorporated Village of Verdigre, are located in the newly redistricted voting precinct of Verdigre Area.

4. The boundaries of Supervisor District #4 of Knox County, Nebraska include the following described territory: All of Bohemia Township; all of Sections 8 through 12 and those portions of Sections 13 through 17 lying north of Highway 12 in Niobrara Township including the incorporated Village of Niobrara; all of Raymond Township including the incorporated Village of Verdel; all of Sparta Township; and Sections 1 through 4 and portions of Sections 9 and 10 lying north of Highway 84 and Sections 5 and 6 lying north of 881 RD in Verdigre Township including the incorporated Village of Verdigre. The Northern Ponca Tribal Areas in Niobrara and Raymond Townships will be entirely in District #4. District #4 contains 1,230 persons more or less according to the 2020 Census of population by the United States Census Bureau. All of Sections 8 through 12 and those portions of Sections 13 through 17 lying north of Highway 12 in Niobrara Township including the incorporated Village of Niobrara and all of Raymond Township including the incorporated Village of Verdel are located in the newly redistricted voting precinct of Niobrara Area. Bohemia and Sparta Townships, and Sections 1 through 4 and portions of Sections 9 and 10 lying north of Highway 84 and Sections 5 and 6 lying north of 881 RD in Verdigre Township including the incorporated Village of Verdigre are located in the newly redistricted voting precinct of Verdigre Area.
5. The boundaries of Supervisor District #5 of Knox County, Nebraska include the following described territory: All of Peoria Township, and Sections 1 through 5 and Sections 9 through 15 in Morton Township including the incorporated City of Bloomfield. District #5 contains 1,206 persons more or less according to the 2020 Census of population by the United States Census Bureau. All of District #5 is located in the voting precinct of Bloomfield Area.
6. The boundaries of Supervisor District #6 of Knox County, Nebraska include the following described territory: All of Columbia Township; all of Dolphin Township; all of Dowling Township; all of Lincoln Township including the incorporated Village of Wausa; and Sections 17 through 22, and Sections 25 through 36 in Eastern Township **LESS** that portion of Section 25 lying north of Knox Avenue and south of Highway 12, and **LESS** the incorporated City of Crofton located in parts of Sections 24, 25 and 26 in Eastern Township. District #6 contains 1,192 persons more or less according to the 2020 Census of population by the United States Census Bureau. Sections 17 through 22, and Sections 25 through 36 in Eastern Township **LESS** that portion of Section 25 lying north of Knox Avenue and south of Highway 12, and **LESS** the incorporated City of Crofton located in parts of Sections 24, 25 and 26 in Eastern Township and Dolphin Township are located in the voting precinct of Crofton Area. Columbia, Dowling, and Lincoln Townships including the incorporated Village of Wausa are located in the newly redistricted voting precinct of Wausa Area.
7. The boundaries of Supervisor District #7 of Knox County, Nebraska include the following described territory: Sections 19 through 22 and Sections 27 through 34 in Creighton Township including the incorporated City of Creighton. District #7 contains 1,219 persons more or less according to the 2020 Census of population by the United States Census Bureau. All of District #7 is located in the newly redistricted voting precinct of Creighton Area.

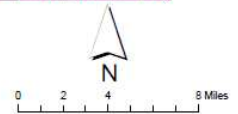
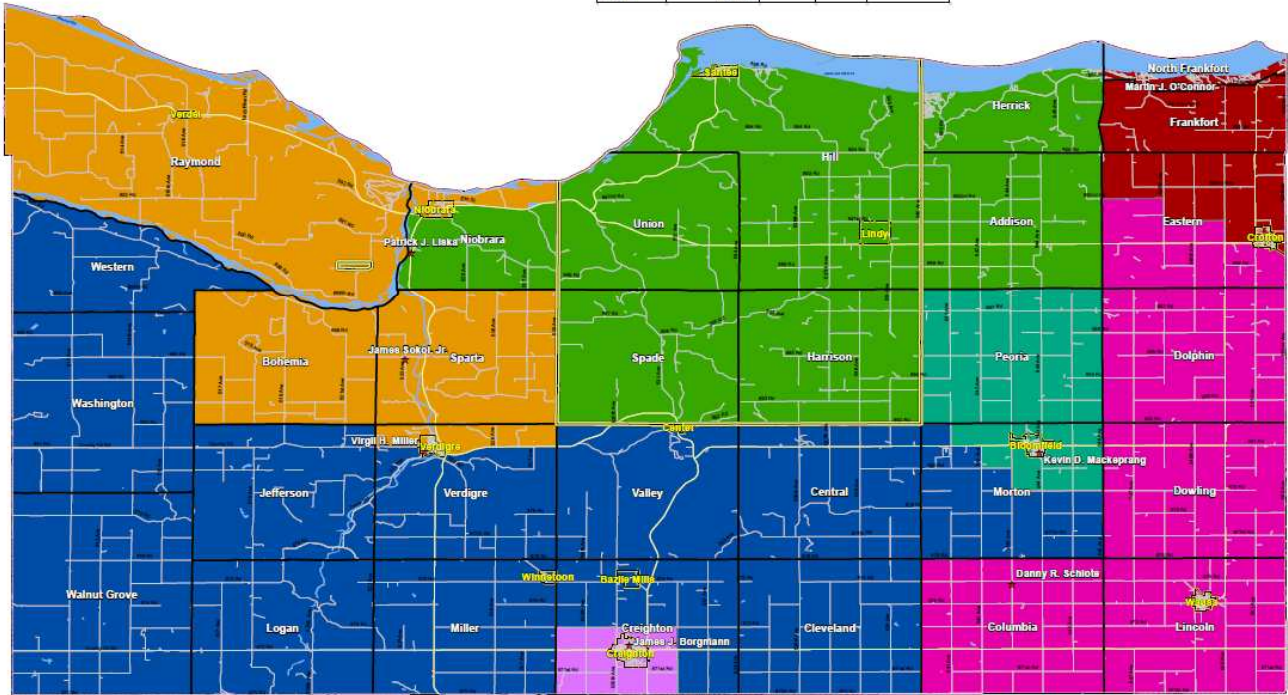

Borgmann to adopt **Resolution #2021 – 44 amending Resolution #2021 – 26** for the correction of Resolution #2021 - 26 that the Verdigre Rural Fire District had chosen a levy of 2.50 cents which was reflected in their filed budget. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION #2021 - 44
AMENDING RESOLUTION #2021 – 26

WHEREAS, the Knox County Board of Supervisors shall adopt a resolution that determines a final allocation of levy authority for Knox County's subdivisions as per Nebraska Statute §77-3443, and

WHEREAS, the Knox County fire districts belong to the Mutual Fire Organization (MFO), and

WHEREAS, that under legislation in 2018 the fire districts in an MFO had to have one year where the levies were the same for all members and could be different for the next two years, and

WHEREAS, the Knox County rural fire districts were allocated 4.5 cents by the Knox County Board of Supervisors in 2019/2020, and

WHEREAS, the Knox County Board of Supervisors allocated up to 4.5 cents to the Knox County rural fire districts as per Nebraska Revised Statute §77-3443 for budget year 2021-2022 noting that not all rural fire districts were going to use the 4.5 cents, and

WHEREAS, Resolution #2021 – 26 that were adopted on August 26, 2021 stated that the Knox County rural fire districts had chosen the following levies: Creighton Rural Fire District – 4.5 cents; Bloomfield Rural Fire District – 3.5 cents; Verdigre Rural Fire District – 2.25 cents; Niobrara Rural Fire District – 4.5 cents; Wausa Rural Fire District – 4.5 cents; and Crofton Rural Fire District – 4.5 cents, and

WHEREAS, after Resolution #2021 – 26 was adopted, it was noticed that the Verdigre Rural Fire District had chosen a levy of 2.50 cents which was reflected in their filed budget, and

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, this Resolution amends Resolution #2021 – 26 where the Knox County rural fire districts chose the following levies and such levies were set by the Knox County Board of Equalization on October 14, 2021: Creighton Rural Fire District – 4.5 cents; Bloomfield Rural Fire District – 3.5 cents; Verdigre Rural Fire District – 2.50 cents; Niobrara Rural Fire District – 4.5 cents; Wausa Rural Fire District – 4.5 cents; and Crofton Rural Fire District – 4.5 cents.
