

PROCEEDINGS OF THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

A regular meeting of the Knox County Board of Supervisors was held in the Boardroom at the Knox County Courthouse in Center, Nebraska on the date of March 10, 2022 at 9:30 a.m. Present were Supervisors Patrick J. Liska District #2, Virgil H. Miller District #3, Kevin D. Mackeprang District #5, Danny R. Schlote District #6, and James J. Borgmann District #7. Absent were Supervisors Martin J. O'Connor District #1 and James Sokol, Jr. District #4. Chairman Mackeprang presiding.

Supr. Miller led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Mackeprang announced to the public that a copy of the Public Open Meeting Act was posted in the Boardroom.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Creighton News newspaper, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was opened to the attendance of the public.

The minutes of the February 24, 2022 meeting were read. Chairman Mackeprang approved the February 24, 2022 meeting minutes with the correction that the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Supervisor Borgmann.

Motion by Chairman Mackeprang, seconded by Supr. Borgmann that all claims, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent were Districts #1 and #4. Motion carried. Claims totaling \$407,016.27 are listed at the end of these proceedings.

Chairman Mackeprang moves the Board recess for Board of Equalization at 10:00 a.m.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 10:13 a.m. with all members present except Supervisors Districts #1 and #4.

Hwy. Supt. Barta met with the Board on the following: 1. Kreg and Ryan Mitteis met with the Board regarding fuel prices and gravel bids. The gravel bid opening will be held at the March 31, 2022 meeting. After a discussion, the Board and Hwy. Supt. Barta said they would work with the bidders with the fuel price fluctuation during the summer months; 2. Chairman Mackeprang signed the contract that was approved at the December 30, 2021 meeting in the amount of \$317,293.50 with John Prouty Construction for the grading on the Verdigre Southwest C005402505P (Walton) bridge project; 3. Motion by Supr. Borgmann, seconded by Supr. Miller to adopt **Resolution #2022 – 03** authorizing Chairman Mackeprang to sign a Project Program Agreement between Knox County and Nebraska Department of Transportation on County Bridge Match Program Project STWD-CBMP(6) on Bridge C0054307220 (Shaw Bridge). By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #5, #6, and #7. Nays none. Absent were Districts #1 and #4. Motion carried.

Hwy. Supt. Barta continued with the following: 5. The order for a Ford 150 pickup for District 5 through the State Bid has been canceled due to unavailability of new Ford pickups any time soon. Hwy. Supt. Barta will be looking for a used pickup; 6. The Chevrolet Malibu car that was ordered for the Courthouse may be here in May; 7. The truck for District 3 may be done soon; 8. Discussed setting a date for applicant interviews for the Crofton Shed/Oil Crew position; 9. Update on the Ash Falls Road micro-surfacing project. The Antelope County Board of Commissioners will do ten miles and they wanted to know if Knox County wanted to do their two miles of the road. The estimated cost would be approximately \$55,000 per mile. Several Board members said they would like to see how it looks before committing. The Board approved micro-surfacing two miles of the Ashfall road. (corrected 3-31-2022); 10. Walton Bridge FEMA project update. Discussed needing additional acres and more fencing; 11. Safety training will be held on March 29, 2022 and CPR/AED training will be held on April 20 2022; 12. Weight limit signs were put up; 13. A meeting will be held on March 31 before job evaluations to discuss the PTO conversion; 14. The search for a tractor truck to pull the lowboy trailer will begin.

County Attorney Thomas reintroduced Hanna Knox Jensen to the Board and informed the Board that Mrs. Jensen will be taking her Bar Exam this summer. Also, he asked if the Board will still allow a Deputy County Attorney position and if so, Mrs. Jensen may be considered for the position if she passes the Bar Exam.

James Coburn with SID #2 met with the Board regarding the one-mile road that runs through the Nebraska Game and Parks property that leads to the Devils Nest Subdivision. Discussion was held on SID #2 purchasing the one-mile portion of road and the procedure.

At 11:24 a.m., Chairman Mackeprang opened the advertised public hearing on Conditional Use Permit Application #CU0040B John D. and Jodi K. Aschoff dba Wolf Run RV Resort.

Jared Reimers with Congressman Adrian Smith's Office in Grand Island updated the Board on Ways and Means Committee activities, trade, rural health care, critical access facilities, insurance perks, telehealth care and in person care billings.

911 Coordinator Kienow and James Almond with the Public Service Commission met with the Board on an interlocal agreement with area counties and three cities to share emergency 911 call handling computer hardware and to become known as Northeast Nebraska Regional E911. Thurston and Pierce Counties are working on their present contracts and will eventually join the new Region. Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to adopt **Resolution #2022 – 05** to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with the Counties of Cedar, Dakota, Dixon and Knox, and the Cities of Norfolk, South Sioux City, and Wayne to be known as Northeast Nebraska Regional E911 and to designate the Knox County Sheriff's Office E911 Coordinator as the Primary representative and the Chief Deputy as the Alternate. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent were Districts #1 and #4. Motion carried.

WHEREAS, John D. & Jodi K. Aschoff dba Wolf Run RV Resort have applied for Conditional Use Permit #CU0040B to add eight campsites for a total of 96 RV campsites, to the Wolf Run RV Resort on part of the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 18, Township 33 North, Range 2 West of the 6th P.M., Knox County, Nebraska which was approved December 31, 2020 and,

WHEREAS, Wolf Run RV Resort (John D. & Jodi K. Aschoff) have applied for an amendment to add an additional six campsites for a total of 40 campsites which will now extend into the East ½ of the Northeast ¼ of Section 19, Township 33 North, Range 2 West of the 6th P.M., and E ½ NE ¼ of Section 19, Township 33 North, Range 2 West of the 6th P.M. all in Knox County, Nebraska,

WHEREAS, the Knox County Planning Commission has given public notice and held a public hearing on February 8, 2022

WHEREAS, the Knox County Planning Commission has found that the application complies with the Knox County Zoning Regulations, and have made a recommendation to approve the permit with the following conditions:

1. Each campsite shall be plainly marked with a map of such numbers provided to the Zoning Administrator.
2. Directional signs shall be installed indicating where sections of lot numbers can be found.
3. Each campsite shall have two parking stalls.
4. All access drives and parking areas shall be surfaced with gravel, asphalt or other material to free the site of mud.
5. The campground shall be compliant with all Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy and Nebraska Health & Human Services standards.
6. All campers shall be licensed and road ready.
7. All amenities (such as porches, screened patios, decks, built-in grills/pizza ovens, and similar items) require a Zoning permit.
8. These conditions of approval will supersede all previous resolutions for Wolf Run RV Resort and apply to the entire resort.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS that the John D. & Jodi K. Aschoff dba Wolf Run RV Resort Conditional Use Permit #CU0040B be approved.

Chairman Mackeprang moves the Board recess at 12:09 p.m. for lunch.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 1:00 p.m. with all members present except Supervisors Martin J. O'Connor District #1 and James Sokol, Jr. District #4.

Discussion was held on funeral leave, catastrophic leave, compensation and hours of work and COVID-19 time.

Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Miller to change the Funeral Leave in the Knox County Employees' Handbook effective July 1, 2022 that regular full-time employees will be granted pay for time lost from work in the event of the death of an immediate family member in accordance with the following schedule: spouse, child, parent, brother, sister, mother-in-law, father-in-law, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, grandparent or grandchild – employee may take up to twenty-four paid hours per occurrence without the use of PTO and the department head must be notified in advance of the need for funeral leave. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent were Districts #1 and #4. Motion carried.

Discussion ensued on the Catastrophic Leave. Motion by Chairman Mackeprang, seconded by Supr. Liska to update the Catastrophic Leave Donation Policy effective July 1, 2022 to replace sick leave with Paid Time Off (PTO), PTO must be donated in hourly increments, the Extended Illness Bank hours may be donated upon separation of employment in any increment with no limit to the number of hours donated to the Catastrophic Leave Bank, recipient employee must have worked at least ninety days for Knox County and must be an employee who earns PTO, and the Elected Official or Department Head must approve the donated hours and they must be provided with a written notice of request for donated hours. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent were Districts #1 and #4. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to approve the changes to the Compensation and Hours of Work in the Knox County Employees Handbook to show regular full-time employees will be those who have completed the introductory period and are regularly scheduled to work thirty or more hours per week and a regular part-time employee is not eligible for County benefits. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent were Districts #1 and #4. Motion carried.

Discussed COVID-19 time. The Federal COVID-19 Extended Sick Leave ended September ~~31~~ 30, 2021 (corrected 3-31-2022). Fourteen employees were out either by isolation or quarantine because of COVID-19 between October 1, 2021 and this date of March 10, 2022 and had to use accrued sick leave/vacation time or the employees who did not have any sick leave accrual were off without pay. Motion by Chairman Mackeprang, seconded by Supr. Liska to end as of March 10, 2022 any further special compensation for COVID-19 and that the fourteen employees who had

COVID-19 time between October 1, 2021 and March 10, 2022 will receive those hours in their sick leave. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent were Districts #1 and #4. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to place on file the Clerk of the District Court February Fee Report. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent were Districts #1 and #4. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Borgmann, seconded by Supr. Miller to place on file the County Treasurer's Return of Sale Proceedings to the County Clerk that certified that on March 7, 2022 all delinquent real estate taxes were offered for public auction and that on March 9, 2022 the public tax sale closed and the private tax sale will begin and continue from day to day until all said land has been offered. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent were Districts #1 and #4. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to authorize Chairman Mackeprang to sign letters of opposition of the change by the Nebraska Department of Agriculture that would permit the use of non-native phragmites, which are noxious in the State of Nebraska, to be used in fully contained wastewater treatment systems lawfully operated by a political subdivision. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent were Districts #1 and #4. Motion carried.

Committee updates was given by SLFRF Administrator Nix. The SLFRF Committee had approved the purchase of a laptop for the Emergency Manager.

Legislative update was given by Sheriff Henery on LR263CA that was introduced by Senator Carol Blood. The proposed Constitutional amendment would require the Legislature to reimburse political subdivisions for imposed new program expenses without full reimbursement by the State for such expenses.

Officials' update was given by Emergency Manager Hintz regarding the confirmed presence of highly pathogenic H5N1 avian influenza (HPA1) in a wild goose near Holmes Lake in Lincoln which is the State's first confirmed case since 2015.

Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to place on file the Receipts Revenue List Report from February 24 through March 9, 2022. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent were Districts #1 and #4. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Liska to go into executive session at 2:08 p.m. so as to protect the reputation of individuals when discussing personnel. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent were Districts #1 and #4. Motion carried. Chairman Mackeprang reiterated the executive session will be held so as to protect the reputation of individuals when discussing personnel. The Board came out at 2:54 p.m.

Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to close at 2:54 p.m. the executive session held on personnel. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent were Districts #1 and #4. Motion carried.
