

PROCEEDINGS OF THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

A regular meeting of the Knox County Board of Supervisors was held in the Boardroom at the Knox County Courthouse in Center, Nebraska on the date of Thursday, March 31, 2022 at 9:30 a.m. Present were Supervisors Martin J. O'Connor District #1, Patrick J. Liska District #2, Virgil H. Miller District #3, Kevin D. Mackeprang District #5, Danny R. Schlote District #6, and James J. Borgmann District #7. Absent was Supervisor James Sokol, Jr. District #4. Chairman Mackeprang presiding.

Supr. O'Connor led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Mackeprang announced to the public that a copy of the Public Open Meeting Act was posted in the Boardroom.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Crofton Journal newspaper, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was opened to the attendance of the public.

The minutes of the March 10, 2022 meeting were read and approved by Chairman Mackeprang with the corrections that the Board approved micro-surfacing two miles of the Ashfall road and the Federal COVID-19 Extended Sick Leave ended September 30, 2021.

Correspondence reviewed was Governor Ricketts invitation for the first national summit on Stop 30 x 30.

Discussion was held on reimbursement for Project #ER-54(25) Control No. 32378 DDIR site C54-01 project (CJ slide repairs) in the amount of \$209,971.09. County Attorney Thomas was present. More research will be made on the reimbursement percentage and presented at the next meeting; 2. The search for a truck to pull the lowboy trailer continues; 3. The new dump truck for the Verdigre County Yard was delivered; 4. A used 2018 regular cab Dodge 1400 4 x 4 white pickup was purchased from Kersten Auto for \$33,000;

5. Road employee job evaluations will be held this date after the PTO conversion informational meeting; 6. Lazy River update. A phone conference with the Army Corps of Engineers was held and they request information as to the cost of getting emergency equipment to Lazy River Acres and other costs, what the cost would be to haul the sand out of the flood plain if dredged and other expenses; 7. The Santee Sioux Tribe will be receiving funds from the new infrastructure bill and discussed were some of their proposed road and bridge projects; 8. Discussed purchasing a new motorgrader, projected cost increases, using the State bid process, and what machine to trade in.

The advertised bid opening for Bloomfield Northeast JEO Project No. 211472.00 for the replacement of a truss bridge on the County oil road (old Highway 121) between Crofton and Bloomfield was held at 11:00 a.m. Knox County reserves the right to reject any and all bids and further reserves the right to accept any bid that best serves the County's needs. Bids received were: **Theisen Construction, Inc., Norfolk NE**, \$1,299,094.75 start date August 15, 2022; **Simon Contractors, North Platte NE** - \$1,419,800.00 start date August 2, 2022; **Dixon Construction, Co., Correctionville IA** - \$1,119,735.93 start date March 27, 2023; **Midwest Infrastructure Inc., Lincoln NE** - \$1,159,543.27 start date September 1, 2022. Liska to place on file the Planning Commission February 8, 2022 meeting minutes. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #4. Motion carried; 3. Administrator Doerr has been working with County Attorney Thomas on resolving the permit issue in the Devils Nest Subdivision; 4. Chairman Mackeprang opened a public hearing at 11:29 a.m. for Conditional Use Permit #CU0047 on ADH Grain Processors, LLC of Bloomfield in the N1/2NW1/4 of Section 10, Peoria Township for the construction of a steam flaking system including two 30,000-bushel grain bins, a small mill office, a scale, and a scale house. Ben Curby, CFO of Epic Land & Cattle LLC, was present to answer questions about the process of the proposed steam flaking system that heats corn kernels and changes to flakes that will increase performance and is easier for cattle to digest. The system will be used for the Epic Cattle/Miller Cattle Feed Lot for now but may consider a commercial product in the future. The cement plant entrance will be used to get to the flaking system, but an extra entrance may be needed in the future which Hwy. Supt. Barta said would have good visibility. Chairman Mackeprang closed the public hearing at 11:37 a.m. There was no one present in opposition. Motion by Supr. Borgmann, seconded by Supr. Miller to adopt **Resolution #2022 – 07** approving Conditional Use Permit #CU0047 for ADH Grain Processors, LLC to construct a steam flaking operation including grain bins, office, scale and scale house in the N1/2NW1/4 of Section 10, T31N, R3W of the 6th P.M., Knox County, Nebraska. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #4. Motion carried.
