A regular meeting of the Knox County Board of Supervisors was held in the Boardroom at the Knox County Courthouse in Center, Nebraska on the date of Thursday, June 30, 2022 at 9:30 a.m. Present were Supervisors Martin J. O'Connor District 1, Patrick J. Liska District #2, Virgil H. Miller District #3, James Sokol, Jr. District #4, Kevin D. Mackeprang District #5, Danny R. Schlote District #6, and James J. Borgmann District #7. Absent was none. Chairman Mackeprang presiding.

Supr. O'Connor led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Mackeprang announced to the public that a copy of the Public Open Meeting Act was posted in the Boardroom.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Crofton Journal newspaper, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was opened to the attendance of the public.

Correspondence reviewed was: 1. Letter from the Secretary of the Interior informing of the PILT payment of \$43,843 to Knox County; 2. Missouri River Northeast Region Community Wildfire Protection Plan update.

The minutes of the June 9, 2022 meeting were read and approved by Chairman Mackeprang.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Borgmann that all claims, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried. Claims totaling \$914,320.01 are listed at the end of these proceedings.

Chairman Mackeprang moves the Board recess at 10:00 a.m. for Board of Equalization.

There was no public comment on agenda items.

Public comment on non-agenda items was given by Supr. Schlote on a recent Lewis and Clark NRD meeting that he attended. One topic discussed at that meeting was the Cedar-Knox Rural Water System program, usage of water and options they are looking into.

Chairman Mackeprang moves the Board recess at 12:07 p.m. for lunch.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 1:00 p.m. with all members present.

The Board, Officials and Department Heads discussed 2023 wages for employees not receiving a deputy wage or newer employees in the step-up process. Options were reviewed. Motion by Supr. Miller, seconded by Supr. Schlote to create employee categories for 2023 with Category 1 to be four appointed officials and the inside office staff not receiving a deputy wage nor the newer employees going through the step-up process, Category 2 to be Road employees not going through the step-up process, and Category 3 to be the Sheriff's Department staff not going through a step-up process,

and further, that the 2023 wage increase for Category 1 employees being four appointed officials and inside office staff not receiving a deputy wage nor going through the step-up process will be 4%. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Liska to approve a 5% wage increase in 2023 for Category 2 employees not going through the step-up process. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. Borgmann to approve a 6% wage increase in 2023 for Category 3 employees not going through a step-up process. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on the 2023 clothing allowance. Sheriff Henery said he was not requesting an increase for the clothing allowance for his staff. Hwy. Supt. Barta and County Assessor McManigal said the clothing allowance for their staff has not increased for a number of years. Motion by Supr. Borgmann, seconded by Supr. Sokol, Jr. to leave the clothing allowance at \$120 per month for the Sheriff and Deputy Sheriffs and \$60 per month for the jailors/dispatchers, to increase the clothing allowance from \$35 per month to \$50 per month for Road employees, to increase the clothing allowance for the Noxious Weed Superintendent from \$35 per month to \$50 per month during his seasonal work period, and to increase the clothing allowance for the County Assessor's staff from \$20 per month to \$40 per month. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. Borgmann to increase the 2023 phone/internet fringe benefit for Zoning Administrator Doerr from \$70 per month to \$100 per month with a breakdown of \$60 per month for phone and \$40 per month for internet. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

The Board will discuss starting wages at the next Board meeting.

The Nebraska Department of Administrative Services would like to dispose of the Games and Park property being approximately a one-mile road located in Section 21 in Herrick Township. Such road has not been a part of Knox County Road System. SID #2 is interested in obtaining ownership of the road as it leads into the Devils Nest Subdivision/SID #2 area. The Nebraska Administrative Services is able to deed the property to the County without it going through the auction process and then the County could deed it to SID #2. County Attorney Thomas drafted an Interlocal Cooperative Agreement between SID #2 and Knox County which the SID #2 signed. Motion by Supr. Liska, seconded by Supr. Sokol, Jr. to approve an Interlocal Cooperative Agreement between Sanitary and Improvement District #2 and the County of Knox for a road being approximately one mile in Section 21, T33N, R3W of the 6th P.M., Knox County, Nebraska that the Nebraska Game and Parks currently owns and is proposed to be disposed of by the Nebraska Department of Administrative Services. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

County Clerk Fischer and SLFRF Nix updated the Board on the candidate filings for township boards. Township Board incumbents have until 5:00 p.m. on Friday, July 15, 2022 to file for office if they want their names shown on the General Election ballot. Incumbent candidate filings have been slow and courtesy calls were made to remind the incumbents of the filing deadline. Nonincumbents have until 5:00 p.m. August 1, 2022 to file. Discussion was held on a letter County Attorney Thomas had sent the Board of Supervisors in 2014 regarding discontinuance of township organization, options if no one runs for township boards, and finding candidates to file.

Committee update was given by SLFRF Nix who informed the Board that the 2022 Leadership Class was beginning July 7 and three newer employees were enrolled. As it is suggested new employees enroll in the Leadership Class and the tuition fee is paid from the ARPA Fund, the question arose as to the use of PTO for the enrollees to attend the class or if the employee would be paid without using PTO. The Board said the Knox County employees enrolled in the Leadership Class will be paid without use of PTO.

Officials' update was given by County Assessor McManigal on a request for a developer's break for the Devils Nest and what it entails.
