A regular meeting of the Knox County Board of Supervisors was held in the Boardroom at the Knox County Courthouse in Center, Nebraska on the date of Thursday, September 29, 2022 at 9:30 a.m. Present were Supervisors Martin J. O'Connor District 1, Patrick J. Liska District #2, Virgil H. Miller District #3, James Sokol, Jr. District #4, Kevin D. Mackeprang District #5, Danny R. Schlote District #6, and James J. Borgmann District #7. Absent was none. Chairman Mackeprang presiding.

SLFRF Administrator Krista Nix led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Mackeprang announced to the public that a copy of the Public Open Meeting Act was posted in the Boardroom.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Crofton Journal newspaper, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was opened to the attendance of the public.

The minutes of the September 8, 2022 meeting were read and approved by Chairman Mackeprang.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Borgmann that all claims except Claim #2022090209, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Borgmann, seconded by Supr. Schlote that Claim #2022090209 payable to Avera Sacred Heart Hospital in the amount of \$5,302.96, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

At 10:43 A.M., Chairman Mackeprang opened a public hearing on Conditional Use Permit Application #CU0049 Cedar Ridge Park and on Conditional Use Permit Application #CU0050 Travis Barney. Chairman Mackeprang closed the two public hearings at 10:47 A.M.

Liska to adopt **Resolution #2022 – 36** approving Conditional Use Permit Application #CU0049 for Cedar Ridge Park for a 15-unit storage building, boat, jet ski, and trailer parking area, three rental units and a community room on a part of Tract 2 per survey dated April 15, 2020 by LS #689, located in the S1/2SW1/4 and the SW1/4SE1/4 of Section 18, T33N, R2W of the 6th P.M., Knox County, Nebraska. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION #2022 - 36

WHEREAS, Cedar Ridge RV Park has applied for Conditional Use Permit #CU0049 for a 15-unit storage building, boat, jet ski, and trailer parking area, three rental units, and community room on a part of Tract 2 per survey dated April 16, 2020 by LS #689, located in the South half of the Southwest Quarter (S1/2 SW ¼) and the Southwest quarter of the Southeast Quarter (SW ¼ SE ¼) of Section 18, Township 33 North, Range 2 West of the 6th Principal Meridian, Knox County, Nebraska more particularly described as follows:

1. One business sign up to 80 square feet is allowed to be placed on the property (not on the right-of-way).
2. No outside storage is allowed except for the boat storage area (limited to boats, jet skis, and trailers) in the southwest corner of the parcel.
3. The self-storage units shall be of neutral color with under the soffit lighting.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS that the Cedar Ridge RV Park Conditional Use Permit #CU0049 be approved.

RESOLUTION #2022 - 38

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Section 39-1722, Nebraska Revised Statutes, the County Board of Supervisors of Knox County, Nebraska, on the 8th day of September 2022 directed the County Highway Superintendent to make a study of the use of three portions of Cottonwood Drive in Lazy River Acres, a platted subdivision described as follows:

1. The North-South portion of Cottonwood Drive contiguous to Lot 1 and Lot 2, except the South 25 feet thereof, Block G;
2. The East-West portion of Cottonwood Drive contiguous to Block F. This excludes the North-South portions of Cottonwood Drive contiguous to Blocks D and G;
3. That part of Cottonwood Drive that was conveyed as a tract to Carolyne Maas in Deed Book 115, Page 757 more fully described as: Commencing at a point 10 feet South of the Southwest corner of Lot 2 in Block D of the plat of Lazy River Acres; thence West 15 feet; thence Northwesterly to the Northeast corner of Lot 1 in Block F of said plat; thence due North to the South bank of the Missouri River; thence Northeasterly following the South bank of said river to a point due North of a point 10 feet East of the Northeast corner of Lot 1 in Block D of said plat; thence Southwesterly to the Northeast corner of Lot 1 in Block D of said plat; All located in Lazy River Acres Subdivision located in Section 16, T33N, R7W of the 6th P.M., Knox County, Nebraska.

WHEREAS, the Highway Superintendent must conduct a study of vacating and abandoning three portions of Cottonwood Drive located in Lazy River Acres, a platted subdivision located in Section 16, T33N, R7W of the 6th P.M., Knox County, Nebraska, and

WHEREAS, on September 29, 2022, County Highway Superintendent did file his report in writing as to such road, containing a recommendation that said portion of Cottonwood Drive be vacated and abandoned, and

BE IT, THEREFORE RESOLVED, by the County Board of Supervisors of Knox County that a public hearing be had as provided in Section 39-1724, Nebraska Revised Statutes, in the Supervisors' Meeting Room in the Courthouse at Center, Nebraska on the 27th day of October, 2022 at the hour of 10:30 A.M. for the purpose of determining whether three portions of Cottonwood Drive located in Lazy River Acres, a platted subdivision located in Section 16, T33N, R7W of the 6th P.M., in Raymond Township, Knox County, Nebraska, be vacated and abandoned.

Clerk of District Court Fischer updated the Board on the Supreme Court mandate of placing a new audio and video system in the Courtroom. The State is paying for the equipment and will own it for five years at which time it then becomes the County's equipment and responsibility for upkeep. New outlets will be required for the installation of the system. Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Sokol, Jr. to authorize Chairman Mackeprang to sign a Memorandum of Understanding – Nebraska Courtroom technology Transfer of Ownership for the facilitation of transfer of audio-visual components, equipment, or full systems (equipment) to be used in the courtroom located in the Knox County Courthouse and such agreement is made between the Administrative Office of the Courts and Probation and Knox County. Discussion was held on the public transit grant that ends December 31, 2022 with Cedar County Transit. The Cedar County Transit has been providing public transit services thirty miles into the east side of Knox County and with the grant ending, Cedar County Commissioners asked if the Knox County Board of Supervisors were considering continuance of the service provided by Cedar County and what they would pay for a local share. Chairman Mackeprang, Supervisors O'Connor and Schlote, and County Clerk Fischer attended a Cedar County Commissioners' meeting on September 27 where Nikki Pinkelman presented information on the proposed partnership and Knox County's local share total for 2023 to be \$23,105 with Federal and State grants to secure the funding for the remainder costs. After a discussion, motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Schlote to approve a pilot program partnership with an annual review in one year with Cedar County for public transit services provided by Cedar County with Knox County's local cost share to be \$23,105. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #2. Motion carried.

Officials' updates were given by the following: 1. County Clerk Fischer informed the Board that the State is issuing a deed to Knox County for the one-mile road owned by the State of Nebraska Game and Parks east of Devils Nest. As per an interlocal agreement, Knox County will deed this road to SID #2; 2. Chairman Mackeprang said that Roger Wiese who was the director of the Northeast Central (corrected 10-13-2022) District Health Department resigned; 3. Chairman Mackeprang and Supr. Schlote gave an update of the recent Northeast District NACO Workshop; 4. Supr. Schlote said that the NorthStar building in West Point may be sold in the near future and relocation of the office has not been determined; 5. Supr. Miller gave an update on the Northeast Nebraska Area Agency on Aging office building, rent issues and possibly looking for a different location in Norfolk.

Motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. Borgmann to go into executive session at 1:48 p.m. so as to protect the reputation of an individual when discussing personnel. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #2. Motion carried.
